#### **Cath Lab Moving Forward**

The Hon. Dr. Eric Hoskins, Minister of Health and Long Term Care visited Windsor Regional Hospital and announced the government's commitment to moving forward with the Cath Lab project and the addition of a second cardiac catheterization table to provide 24/7 angioplasty. The Minister also confirmed funding to relocate Day Surgery to the 2nd floor to accommodate the Cath Lab locating to the 5th floor of the Ouellette Campus.

The \$18 million capital funding announcement sets in motion the planning and paving the way to improved service for Windsor and Essex County. "This new project will allow Windsor Regional Hospital to improve operational efficiency and meet the standards of care for regional cardiac programs identified by the Ontario Cardiac Care Network," stated Minister Hoskins. Noting the

current limitations of one Cath Lab means hundreds of patients this year are sent to Detroit for the procedure and now, this will mean WRH will be able to provide more cardiac services right here in Windsor, closer to home.

The Heart Breaker Challenge is the first of its kind in the Windsor/Essex region. According to Jason Petro, one of the organizers, the main goal is to raise funds for the Cardiac

Wellness Pulmonary and Rehab Centre. "Both programs support hundreds of local patients each year with their recovery and management of their cardiac or pulmonary condition," stated Jason. "The Breaker challenges participants to walk, jog or run an approximate 5 to 7 kilometer course with a number of obstacles throughout. The Heart Breaker Challenge raised over \$72,000 as a result of the May 2014 event.

# **Bladder Scanner Enhances Care In Emergency Department**

Thanks to a generous donation from local fundraising group, In Honour of the Ones We Love, the Emergency Department at the Met Campus has a new Bladder Scanner.

The new piece of medical equipment means fewer infection rates, reduced wait times and less discomfort for patients. Previously, when this kind of procedure is required, it means the insertion of a urinary catheter to drain the bladder which could be painful to the patient.

The Bladder Scanner is much less intrusive, using ultrasound waves to create an image of the bladder's interior as well as the

readout of how much urine it is holding. It is available to children and older males with prostate issues and patients afflicted with cancer.

In Honour of the Ones We Love has supported many projects to improve the experience in hospital for the patient and their families.


