### A message of thanks from a COVID-19 survivor

Victor Winter can barely remember a thing from the week before he was taken to the hospital and placed on a ventilator to fight against a virus his doctors would later identify as COVID-19.

This was back in March, when most of us were only just beginning to hear about the deadly virus.

After spending 12 hours in the hospital in Leamington, Victor was intubated and taken to Windsor Regional Hospital, where he was almost immediately placed on a ventilator.

A week later, his heart began to fail. His wife, Marilyn, was gently told to prepare for the worst.

"The doctors were working with a virus with which they were unfamiliar," Victor reminds us now. "Researching and checking with colleagues around the world."

Victor pulled through. On Good Friday, doctors removed him from the ventilator and by the end of April, he was discharged. Although his fight to fully recover continues.

Victor and his family are deeply grateful to medical staff, who saw him off with a ceremony on the day he was discharged. In fact, he penned a beautiful letter of thanks, of which we have included an excerpt for you below.



#### MESSAGE TO COVID PATIENT CAREGIVERS

I've spent 6 weeks here in this place.

You have looked after me, fought for my life, allowed my family to communicate with me.

From the bottom of my heart: I thank you.

During my time here, I have watched you as you bravely served your patients, wearing your PPE, unfailingly

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courteous and friendly despite adverse conditions.

On my last night at Met, I heard you comfort a patient who screamed in pain most of the night. As you tried to reorient another patient who begged you to end his life. As you kept your cheerful demeanour through all of it.

I could see the strain that these pandemic responsibilities were placing on your shoulders.


You give us hope. As I watched you work, your quiet friendly professionalism shone through in a way that gave me hope.

You inspire us! In your yellow scrubs and goggles and masks ... you are beautiful!

Thank you for your professionalism and your humanity. Thank you for taking on the added risks posed by this crafty and pernicious virus.
