Hospitalist Program Standardization: Providing a More Seamless Continuum of Care to Patients

Last month, WRH launched a new standardized Hospitalist Program to provide a more seamless continuum of care to patients. Hospitalist Physicians are now present on the units at both campuses for the entire day/shift to increase the opportunity for nursing and allied staff to access and collaborate with the Physicians and monitor the patient's plan of care. Best practice strategies, such as placement in assessment bays, Physician led Care Rounds, and standardized discharge huddles, have been implemented.

The following is an example of how hospitalists care for patients at WRH:

Its 7:15 am and Dr. Seski has already discussed all of his possible discharges with the Short Stay Unit Nurse Practitioner and Utilization Nurse, who have begun prioritizing the patients being discharged today.

He is now about to round on Mrs. Jones, who is a newly admitted 70-year-old patient with Pneumonia on the Short Stay Unit in an Assessment Bay. Prior to rounding he is discussing with Sherri an RN on the Short Stay unit, the clinical status of Mrs. Jones and her condition through the night. Dr. Seski will now round on Mrs. Jones, talking to her about her condition and how she will be moved to an inpatient bed on the Short Stay Unit where she will continue to be cared for by Dr. Seski and he will help prepare her for discharge home.

Dr. Seski will round on his 15 other patients throughout the morning before he attends Physician Led Care Rounds where he will discuss the plan of care of Mrs. Jones and all of his other patients with the multidisciplinary care team. Once Care Rounds are completed, Dr. Seski will communicate Mrs. Jones' plan of care and discharge plans with her son and husband.

These actions are standard for all patients on all of the Hospitalist covered units at both the Metropolitan and Ouellette Campus. Physicians following this daily standard work helps support patient-centered care and supports discharges early in the day.

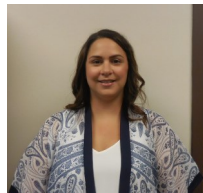

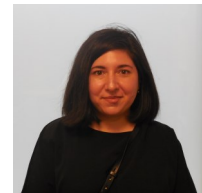

Accreditation 2019: Surgical Safety Checklist

We are now two and a half months away from our on-site Accreditation Canada survey November 25-29th!

Work continues moving forward in addressing the accreditation standards that need improvement. Meanwhile, evidence continues to be shared across WRH about how we meet these standards.

Every week, we are emailing to everyone the latest "ROP of the Week" featuring Required Organizational Practices. This week's theme is the surgical safety checklist. Standardized across both campuses, WRH uses a Surgical Safety Checklist (SSCL) as a tool to enhance patient safety in our operating suites. The SSCL confirms that critical safety steps are completed in an effort to minimize any risk that might endanger the lives or well being of our surgical patients. The SSCL is utilized in accordance with the World Health Organization (WHO, 2009) and the Safe Surgery Saves Lives Challenge.

#RECIPEOFTHEWEEK

Sweet Potato & Lentil Sheppard's Pie

Makes 4 servings / Preparation: 20 min / Total Time: 45 min

INGREDIENTS

- 2 tbsp coconut oil/vegetable oil
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 1 carrot, finely chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 sprigs thyme or rosemary
- 1/2 tsp salt, divided
- 1/2 tsp pepper
- 1/3 cup tomato paste
- 340g precooked soy protein
- 1 cup frozen corn or peas
- 1/3 cup dried green or brown lentils, rinsed
- 450g cubed peeled sweet potatoes
- 2 yellow-fleshed potatoes, peeled and cubed

DIRECTIONS

In large ovenproof skillet, heat 1 tbsp of the oil over medium heat; cook onion, carrot, garlic, thyme, 1/4 tsp of the salt and pepper, stirring occasionally, until onion is softened, 6 minutes. Stir in tomato paste; cook for 30 seconds. Stir in soy protein and lentils; cook, breaking up with spoon, for 2 minutes. Stir in 3 cups water; bring to boil. Reduce heat to medium; cook until lentils are tender and mixture is thickened, about 25 minutes. Discard thyme; stir in corn. Meanwhile, in saucepan, cover sweet potatoes and yellow-fleshed potatoes with cold water; bring to boil. Cover and cook until potatoes are fork-tender, 12 to 15 minutes. Drain. Return potatoes to pan over medium heat and shake pan to dry potatoes, about 1 minute. Using potato masher, mash with remaining 1 tbsp oil and 1/4 tsp salt. Position rack in top third of oven. Top lentil mixture with potato mixture. Broil until top is lightly golden and edge is crispy, 4 to 5 minutes.
