

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LAUNCHING RL6

On December 4th, Windsor Regional Hospital will be launching the upgrade to the electronic submission of unusual occurrences using the RL6 software. RL6 is a comprehensive safety, quality and risk-management solution that helps manage the reporting of unusual occurrences and adverse/critical events. RL6 will be launched at the Ouellette Campus initially to allow staff there to migrate off the current HDGH Patient Safety RISK Reporting System to the Windsor Regional Hospital system.

A team has been working diligently to prepare the system for this implementation. There is minimal change to the content within the system: however, the 'look and feel' is different. It has a refreshing and sleek design that is similar to the look of an iPhone and allows for easy access and real time alerts.


- Phase 1 Includes the rollout of the patient safety reporting system to the Ouellette Campus effective December 4, 2013.
- Phase 2 Includes the rollout of employee incidents to the Ouellette Campus in January 2014.
- Phase 3 Includes the rollout of patient safety and employee incidents to the Met Campus later in January, 2014.



Training of Directors, Managers, CRN's and Unit Champions started at the Ouellette Campus last week with the staff being trained prior to launch date. Knowledge of the system is relatively simple and only requires approximately ten minutes of on-unit training. Training will continue during each phase of the rollout.

WINDSOR REGIONAL HOSPITAL RECEIVES DISTINCTION FOR TRAUMA


Trauma Services at the Ouellette Campus recently participated, in a unique new program called 'Trauma Distinction' through Accreditation Canada from November 17 to the 20th. The trauma expert surveyors from Vancouver, along with a facilitator from Accreditation Canada reviewed everything including the provincial system, regional hospital oversight and leadership, prehospital care, emergency preparedness, rehabilitation, injury prevention, acute care, education, indicators and patient perspectives.

The depth of passion, outstanding care and support for trauma patients was highlighted by the site surveyors during their interviews with staff and patients. It was demonstrated how successful the trauma team work together in saving lives, providing Accreditation Canada and the Trauma Association of Canada examples and feedback toward setting a standard for evaluation of Trauma Distinction across the country.
