Mr. Meconi approached the hospital about a year ago, suggesting he would like to support healthcare in a way that would honour the memory of his late wife, Rosemary and mother, Gilda Meconi.

"We have always wanted to improve and upgrade the diagnostic part of medicine in the hospitals laboratories, so part of the money is going toward newer technology and equipment to catch up with the personalized diagnosis and treatment of cancer," said Dr. David Shum, Chief of Pathology for WRH. The funding will also be used to transfer programs and staff to a centralized Pathology Laboratory recommended a few years ago.


