- Implement the CORE Back Tool in primary care for the assessment & management of low back pain including, screening for red flags and risk of chronicity.
- Facilitate patients with lifestyle related self-management techniques for low back pain.
- Identify the appropriate criteria for evidence-based investigations and referrals.

Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Raise awareness and educate yourself, family and friends about breast cancer throughout the month of October. Breast cancer is the most common cancer in Canadian women, yet only 61% of Ontario women aged 50 to 74 were screened in 2010-2011. There are still many women who would benefit from regular breast screening. Women who are both average and high risk can be screened through the Ontario Breast Screening Program (OBSP). Average risk women, 50 to 74 should be screened with mammography every two years - and no doctor's referral is needed. High-risk women, 30 to 69, need to be referred by their doctor for an annual mammography and MRI. With OBSP sites at both campuses, it's very convenient.
