#### MINISTER ANNOUNCES FUNDING FOR MEN'S HEALTH PROGRAM

The Hon. Teresa Piruzza, MPP, Windsor West, Minister of Child and Youth Services and Women's Issues held a media conference on March 7 announcing multi-year funding to support a Regional Comprehensive Men's Health Program at Windsor Regional Hospital.

The Regional Comprehensive Men's Health Program will result in earlier detection of prostate cancer, decrease wait times if prostate cancer is diagnosed, reduce wait times to effective treatment options, help attract and retain the best clinical leaders in the world, and begin to repatriate cases back to Windsor and Essex County, allowing residents to get cancer care closer to home.

The new program will provide a one-stop-shop for men suffering urological disorders, bring together, Urologists, Radiologists, Oncologists, Pathologists, and Surgeons under one program at Windsor Regional Hospital, Met Campus. The program will be modeled after the successful Women's Breast Health Centre and Lung Diagnostic & Assessment Program.

"This is a game changer for our region where, back in 2009, as a team, we had a vision to create a Regional Comprehensive Men's Health Program," stated David Musyj. "After the government made a promise to operationally fund the program and the Windsor Essex Cancer Centre Foundation initiated 'It's In Your Jeans' capital campaign to fund the Da Vinci Surgical Robot System, we now have Teresa Piruzza to thank for fulfilling the promise!"
