A UNIQUE BLEND OF TALENT SUPPORTING WINDSOR HOSPITALS



DID YOU KNOW?

Windsor was the first Canadian city with an electric street car system, which was introduced in 1886. Other Canadian cities soon followed suit, with St. Catherines in 1887 and Toronto in 1889. Although initially the track spanned only a small portion of Windsor along the Windsor-Detroit waterfront on Riverside Drive, the service was expanded with an extension south along Ouellette Avenue in 1893. No doubt it was to provide access to Hôtel-Dieu Hospital.
