Most Needed Items:

Peanut butter, jam, rice, dried beans, stews, canned tomatoes, baby foods, snacks, fruit juice, raisins, soda crackers, cereal, tea, coffee, sugars, ketchup, mustard, relishes. Also Needed:

Spaghetti sauce, dry pastas, canned meat, canned fish, canned fruit, canned vegetables and soups, diapers, formula, puddings, cake mixes, baking items, flour, honey, cheese whiz, macaroni and cheese.





A mask and eye protection are required to protect the mucous membranes of the nose and mouth from anticipated sprays and splashes of blood, body fluids, secretions, excretions or coughing individuals.

Airborne particles can remain suspended in the air, travel on air currents, and then be inhaled by others. This is why rooms with

special ventilation are required, and any therapy provided must occur in this room with the doors closed.

N95 respirator failure is primarily related to poor fit and leakage around the face seal. Always perform a seal check before entering an airborne infection isolation room.
