Medbuy Grants Influence Patient Care

Medbuy members continue to conduct research through use of the R.E.D. Fund which support best practices in healthcare. Christine Donaldson, Director of Pharmacy for Windsor Regional Hospital shares some of her team's recent research achievements.

A study by WRH pharmacy resident, Marta Malkinska, 'Traditional versus once weekly intravenous iron therapy in hemodialysis patients' evaluated the efficacy and safety of a weekly IV iron regiment in comparison to traditional IV iron regiment in the hospitals dialysis unit. Anemia is a common complication of chronic kidney disease in patients requiring hemodialysis (HD). The study found that once weekly iron dosing significantly reduces erythropoiesisstimulating agent (ESA) consumption (a finding with cost-savings potential for HD centres), increased transferrin saturation (TSAT), and increased iron concentration.

"One of our goals is to impact practice, to see this research integrated into guidelines, as well as generate interest into further study," indicated Donaldson. Members of her pharmacy team presented their findings at a poster presentation at the Canadian Society of Nephrology Conference in Vancouver in April of this year and currently are pursuing publication opportunities in peer-reviewed journals. Thanks go to preceptors, Wasim El-Nekidy and Derrick Soong.

Christine indicates that the Medbuy R.E.D. Fund support provided her team with an opportunity to find a creative way to solve collating all the data collected by hiring a pharmacy intern to finalize the outcomes and bring the work together into a publication-ready format. Another project on the horizon is "Antimicrobial study: Pharmacist impact on Integrating Rapid Microorganism Identification with Timely Receipt of Effective Antimicrobial Therapy". This project was inspired partly by the introduction of a new technology at Windsor Regional Hospital where, a mass spectrometer could be used to expedite the process of identifying microorganisms. Our Infectious Diseases Pharmacist, Lynn Nadeau and the Microbiology Department wants to demonstrate that new technology will improve turn around time at the hospital.

"A requirement of our pharmacy residency program, now in its fifth year, is for every resident to complete a research project and share that knowledge through publication. The Pharmacy Department at WRH is proof that research is alive and going strong," stated Donaldson.

New Software (mAiRiner) To Assist Hand Hygiene Audits

New hand hygiene auditing and reporting software has been acquired to assist users with the collection, reporting and distribution of hand hygiene compliance. Ultimately, the auditing process will be completely automated. Being web-based, the auditors are able to access up to date information using their smart phones, laptops or desktops.

Benefits of the software include real-time results, automatic report distribution, automatic scorecard integration and ability to drill down to identify key issues related to hand hygiene compliance immediately! Another plus is the opportunity to create schedules for each patient care area to keep current on compliance. Comments on the system can be captured for each observation, allowing with continuation of feedback on the use of PPE (personal protective equipment) or other infection control concerns.

Infection Control Practitioners along with date entry and decision support staff have been trained to use the new software. Currently, paper based systems will continue to be used by auditors who will enter information into the software.

WRH and HDGH Collaborate To Improve Access To Complex Continuing Care And Inpatient Rehabilitation

Providing patients with timely access to the right services at the right time, is a key element in helping patients achieve their maximum level of recovery to enable their return to independent living in the community.

A significant number of patients, 872 per year, move between Acute Care at Windsor Regional Hospital (WRH) into the Complex Continuing Care (CCC) and Inpatient Rehabilitation (Rehab) programs at Hôtel-Dieu Grace Healthcare (HDGH).

In order to improve transitions from acute to post-acute care, HDGH and WRH are collaborating on a new intake process. According to John Norton, Director Strategic Projects, intake staff from HDGH will be located in acute care and will work with the acute care team on a daily basis, at both the Metropolitan and Ouellette campuses.

"This collaboration will assist with early identification and assessment of patients who may benefit from Complex Continuing Care and Rehab and facilitate more timely movement of patients that require post-acute care at HDGH," stated John. "The improved patient flow will also assist with access to acute care beds by reducing the number of patients that are Alternate Level of Care waiting for CCC and Rehab."

Denean has been a Registered Nurse since 1986 and an employee of Windsor Western, Windsor Regional and now Hôtel-Dieu Grace Healthcare. Prior to coming to Rehabilitation she had 10 years of medical/surgical experience. Denean has 18 years of Rehabilitation experience, including taking on the role of Charge/Intake Nurse in 2002. She achieved her Certification in Rehabilitation Nursing with the CNO in 2008.

Dianne has been a Registered Nurse since 1971. Prior to relocating to Windsor in 1980, Dianne worked at Toronto Sick Children's Hospital, Bowmanville Memorial Hospital and Ross Memorial Hospital in Lindsay, gaining experience in paediatric neurosurgery, medicine and ICU. She continued her career in Windsor at Metropolitan Hospital in 1980 working in ICU and CCU. She transferred to the Western Campus in 2000 working on implementing the Care Manager and Order Entry Systems. She moved into the role of Intake Nurse for Complex Continuing Care and Palliative Care in 2001 facilitating admissions to these programs.





STOP and sanitize

do your part to reduce the spread of infection



Windsor Regional Hospital believes that Infection Prevention and Control is vital to patient safety. ALL persons working at both campuses of the hospital must have a RESPONSIBILITY to practice good infection prevention and control.

The hospital has adopted the "Stop and Sanitize" campaign. Hand hygiene is the single most effective way to prevent health-care associated infections and the spread of antibiotic resistant organisms.

All staff, patients and visitors are asked to perform hand hygiene when entering/exiting the hospital. There are 2 methods for performing hand hygiene:

Alcohol-Based Hand Rub (ABHR)

PREFERRED when hands are not visibly soiled.
 Rub 1-2 pumps of ABHR into palms, fingers, wrists, etc. for 15 seconds (or until dry).

Hand Washing (Soap and Water)


Apply soap to wet hands and lather 15 seconds. Rinse thoroughly under warm running water. Dry with a paper towel and turn off tap (and open door) with a paper towel. Note: If hands are visibly soiled and there is no running water, use a moist towelette to remove visible soil and then ABHR.




Stethoscopes are non-critical medical equipment and require low level disinfection after each use. Alcohol

based wipes may be used in order to prevent damage to the diaphragm.
