TAKE THE PLEDGE TO END BULLYING

Windsor Regional Hospital and Hôtel-Dieu Grace Healthcare are proud to once again support CTV's "The Pledge to End Bullying," a community-wide initiative that raises public awareness about the impact of bullying - in school, at work and at home.

Bullying is defined as a form of repeated, persistent and aggressive behaviour directed at an individual or individuals that is intended to cause (or should be known to cause) fear and distress and/or harm to another person's body, feelings, self-esteem or reputation. Bullying occurs in a context where there is a real or perceived power imbalance.

I BELIEVE THAT EVERYBODY HAS THE RIGHT TO LIVE IN A COMMUNITY WHERE THEY FEEL SAFE, INCLUDED, VALUED AND ACCEPTED REGARDLESS OF DIFFERENCES.

Different forms of bullying include:

Physical – hitting, shoving, stealing or damaging property;



Social - excluding others from a group or spreading gossip or rumours about them; and

Electronic (commonly known as **cyberbullying**) – spreading rumours and hurtful comments through the use of cellphones, e-mail, text messaging and social networking sites.

BLUEBERRY LEMON COUNTRY COBBLER

Makes 8 servings - Serving size: ½ cup (125 mL) Cooking time: 20-25 min

INGREDIENTS

Filling

3 tbsp (45 mL) sugar 1/4 cup (60 mL) water 1 ripe medium pear, diced 1 tbsp (15 mL) cornstarch

1 lb (450 g) fresh/thawed) blueberries 1 tbsp (15 mL) lemon zest

Topping

3/4 cup (180 mL) white whole-wheat flour 2 1/2 tbsp (40 mL) sugar 1 tsp (5 mL) baking powder ½ cup (125 mL) fat-free buttermilk 2 tbsp (30 mL) canola oil 1 eaa white

1 tsp (5 mL) lemon zest Canola oil cooking spray

1/4 tsp (2 mL) ground cinnamon

PREPARATION

Preheat oven to 400° F/200° C. Coat an 11 × 7-inch baking pan with canola oil cooking spray. Combine sugar, cornstarch, and water in a large non-reactive saucepan. Stir until cornstarch is completely dissolved, then stir in berries and pears. Bring to a boil over medium-high heat and boil 1 full minute. Remove from heat and stir in 1 tablespoon (15 mL) zest. Place fruit mixture in the baking pan. Combine flour, 2 tablespoons (30 mL) of the sugar, and baking powder in a medium bowl. Combine buttermilk, canola oil, egg white, and remaining 1 teaspoon (5 mL) zest in a small bowl. Add buttermilk mixture to flour mixture and stir until just blended. Spoon batter into eight small mounds on top of the filling. Mix remaining sugar with cinnamon and sprinkle on top of cobbler. Bake 20-25 minutes or until filling is bubbly and a wooden pick inserted into the topping comes out clean. Let stand 20 minutes to absorb flavors.
