## SAFE SEATS SAVE CHILDREN!

Windsor Regional Hospital was a proud sponsor of a free car seat clinic for parents on February 8, 2014. The clinic, operated by volunteers of the local organization, Safe Seats Save Children, ensures that child car seats are structurally sound; installed properly; and, adjusted to best fit the child, preventing injuries in the event of a vehicle collision.

The clinic attracted some 80 participants, including new parents installing car seats for the first time, as well as parents of children who are older and who need to take a look at whether they have the right seats in place or if adjustments are required.

The event was held at Windsor Fire Station #7. Gioia Levesque, a member of Safe Seats Save Children, who is also on staff in the NICU (Neonatal Intensive Care Unit) at the Met Campus attended the clinic

Gioia and her team are certified car seat technicians who provide the free inspections. Their continued experience is invaluable to parents who may not be sure whether they are doing all they can to protect their most precious cargo!

## Harnessing the Power of the World Wide Web for Cognitive Assessment

Guest speaker: Professor Adrian M. Owen, Canada Excellence Research Chair (CERC) in Cognitive Neuroscience and Imaging at the Western University. His work combines structural and functional neuroimaging with neuropsychological studies of brain-injured patients. His most recent work, reported in the journals *Science* (2006), *The New England Journal of Medicine* (2010), and *The Lancet* (2011) has shown that functional neuroimaging can reveal conscious awareness in some patients who appear to be entirely vegetative, and can even allow some of these individuals to communicate their thoughts and wishes to the outside world. These findings have attracted widespread media attention on TV, radio, in print and online and have been the subject of several TV and radio documentaries. Dr. Owen has played multiple editorial roles including 8 years as Deputy Editor of *The European Journal of Neuroscience*. Since 1990, Dr. Owen has published over 200 articles and chapters in scientific journals and books.
