Social Workers at the Metropolitan and Ouellette campuses provide access to community support services specific to coping with an illness, a loved one's illness or caregiver stress. Social workers are available to provide clients with counseling regarding concerns related to depression, grief and loss.

Social Workers can also assist with referrals to community agencies for any issues related to addictions. Referrals can also be made for physical, emotional or sexual abuse counseling and referrals for community follow up.

This year's Social Work Week theme throughout Ontario is "Champions of Positive Change," which reflects a mandate to ensure clients have the rights and opportunities they need to fulfill their potential.
