Case Costing Aims To Provide Clear Snapshot Of Hospital Patient Costs

A major project is under way that will eventually provide Windsor Regional Hospital with a more accurate snapshot of the cost of an individual patient's journey through our system.

"Case costing" is a method of allocating both direct and indirect costs of an individual patient – taking into account all of the costs that are incurred from the moment a patient is triaged or arrives for a procedure or diagnostic, all the way until they leave or are discharged from hospital.



WRH was given the opportunity by the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care to take part in a case costing initiative that has already been developed and implemented at four dozen Ontario hospitals.

In an era where more of the overall funding a hospital receives from the provincial government is based on "quality-based procedures" – which in its simplest terms sets out how much money a health care provider receives for their contribution to a patient's journey. The more accurate and fulsome the data, the better able WRH and other hospitals can be in substantiating funding allocations by the province.

Additionally, case costing allows WRH to better assess the true cost for every patient who comes to either campus, and benchmark ourselves against similarly sized institutions around Ontario.

For the IT and hospital professionals of TransForm and WRH working on this intense project, it's not a simple task. Both campuses were developed using different systems and processes for data collection and the project looks into how to compile data from a number of sources to provide a more complete picture.

"Managing the data throughout a facility means tracking vast amounts of data, which can vary depending on the source," said Mark Fathers, WRH Chief Financial Officer.

A team of individuals gathered for a two-day session to map out a strategy for the project and will be working on the project for several months.

It takes two to three years for an institution to become "experts" and produce quality information. The hospital will work with the Ministry to review the data as the case costing project develops.

The Steering Committee for this project is comprised of Gina Bulcke (Director, Organizational Effectiveness), Linda Campeau (Director, Health Management and Communications) and John Quint (Director, Financial Services).

# **Make Ahead Berry Breakfast Parfaits**

Makes 4 servings

Preparation Time: 10 min / Cooking Time: 2 min

Refrigeration time: 8 hours

Make your own beautiful breakfast parfaits in the evening and you've got a nutritious and delicious breakfast ready to go in the morning. The oats soften perfectly as the parfaits sit in the refrigerator overnight.

### Ingredients

- 1 cup large-flake rolled oats
- 1/4 cup chopped almonds, pecans or walnuts (optional)
- 1 tbsp (ground flax seeds (optional)
- 1 1/2 cup 2% plain yogurt
- 1 1/2 cup 2% vanilla yogurt
- 2 cups blueberries, sliced strawberries and/or raspberries

### Instructions

In a skillet over medium heat, toast large-flake rolled oats and nuts (if using), stirring constantly, for 2 to 3 minutes or until golden and fragrant. Immediately transfer to a bowl and let cool. Stir in flax seeds (if using). In a bowl, whisk together plain yogurt and vanilla yogurt. Alternately layer oat mixture, yogurt and berries in four individual 1-1/2-cup (375 mL) reusable containers with lids or tall glasses. Seal with lids or cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate for at least 8 hours or up to 2 days.




### Parkwood Hospital Presents: Acquired Brain Injury Survivor and Family Education Series


