Heart Healthy Cheezy Potatoes

Makes 12 servings

Preparation Time: 15 min / Cooking Time: 1 hour 10 min

Reduced-fat soup, reduced-fat cheddar cheese, and light sour cream help transform this favorite holiday casserole into a hearty-healthy side dish..



Ingredients

1 - 10 3/4 ounce can reduced-fat/sodium condensed cream of chicken soup 1 cup shredded reduced-fat sharp cheddar cheese (4 ounces)

1/2 cup fat-free milk

1/2 cup light dairy sour cream

1/3 cup finely chopped onion or 2 tablespoons dried minced onion

1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper

1 30 ounce package frozen shredded or diced hash brown potatoes, thawed 1/2 cup crushed cornflakes or crushed wheat cereal flakes

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Lightly grease a 2-quart rectangular baking dish; set aside. In a very large bowl, combine soup, cheese, milk, sour cream, onion, and pepper. Stir in potatoes. Spread mixture evenly in prepared baking dish.

Cover and bake for 45 minutes; stir potatoes. Sprinkle with cornflakes. Bake, uncovered, for 20 to 25 minutes more or until heated through and bubbly. Let stand for 10 minutes before serving.
