Aiden Pitre: A Hero to Paediatric Services

Aiden is a Grade 8 student at St. John Vianney School in Windsor and wanted to give back to a program that helped him when he was 9 years old. He had to spend a month in Paediatric Services in 2014 due to becoming very ill suddenly. Aiden experienced a successful outcome and decided to 'pay it forward'.

"Paediatric staff did so many things for me to help through the rough days. I was confined to my room; however, Child Life staff provided an opportunity to select a new toy or game that I could bring home, something I never forgot" said Aiden. "I was amazed to hear that the community donated items throughout the year to make kids like me experience the same feeling."

Aiden and his Grade 8 Confirmation Class at St. John Vianney gathered new toys, books, portable DVD players, Playstation 3, Xbox 360 and WiiU games, along with a large assortment of craft items, totaling almost \$5000 in value. Tecumseh Fire Services assisted by becoming a drop-off centre on behalf of the project. The community was so supportive that, \$1700 in cash was donated as well which will go toward a specific piece of medical equipment required.

#RECIPEOFTHEWEEK

Asparagus & New Potato Frattata

Makes 3 servings Preparation: 10 min Cooking Time: 12 min

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup new potatoes, quartered
- 3/4 cup asparagus tips
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 6 eggs, beaten
- 1/2 cup cheddar, grated
- Arugula or mixed leaves, to serve



DIRECTIONS

Heat the broiler to high. Put the potatoes in a pan of cold salted water and bring to the boil. Once boiling, cook for 4-5 mins until nearly tender, then add the asparagus for a final 1 min. Drain. Meanwhile, heat the oil in an ovenproof frying pan and add the onion. Cook for about 8 mins until softened. Mix the eggs with half the cheese and season well. Pour over the onion in the pan, then scatter over the asparagus and potatoes. Top with the remaining cheese and put under the broiler for 5 mins or until golden and cooked through. Cut into wedges and serve from the pan with salad.

Staff presented highlights from three major SOP projects: Standard Unit, Quality Based Procedures, and Medicine Patient Flow. They discussed how these projects are helping to reduce wait times, reduce patient harm and improve communication between patients, families and care providers. All of this work is strengthening the patient care process and workflow that will eventually guide the design of a new acute care hospital.

"We have 1700 people who have worked so hard to get these results and I have to tell you, these results are amazing," said Chief Operating Officer and Chief Nursing Executive, Karen McCullough. "It takes dedication, it takes leadership and it takes all of you to say it matters and I am going to make a difference for our patients."

McCullough says after three years, the results are impressive and the good news is, we are not done yet.



What is the Regional HIS Transformation Project?

The five hospitals in the Erie St. Clair (ESC) region currently all operate their own hospital information systems (HIS). This project is about implementing a single, common HIS across the region so we are equipped with state-of-the-art technology to

Across Erie St. Clair, we are now collectively ready to work together and make this new system a reality

Why are we doing this and why now?

Collectively, our technology is out-of-date and modern HIS solutions are key enablers to delivering safer, higher-quality care. This ESC clinical transformation will enable a one patient-one record strategy for the region, and create an all-around better experience for patients and staff alike. A regional approach to HIS is not only rooted in leading practice, but is also aligned with the mandate recently released by the provincial government which encourages hospitals to partner together and create shared HIS solutions – our Regional HIS Transformation Project is part of the vision for a more collaborative, coordinated, and connected health system across the province.

When is this happening and what is my role?

Efforts to set this project's foundation have commenced, and it is clear this is going to be a multi-year journey. Effort required will vary by role and everyone will have the opportunity to provide input in the coming months and beyond.
