For small spills of blood or body fluid, don gloves and face protection if required. First use paper towel or linen to soak up and contain the spill. Pour disinfectant over the spill and allow to sit for contact time prior to cleaning the spill.

Hospital Blood Challenge – It's In You To Give!

This month, WRH is participating in the 9th annual Ontario Hospital Challenge, where hospital employees across Ontario roll up their sleeves to Give Life, and see who will be this year's champion!

Every minute of every day, someone in Canada needs blood and blood products, and in most cases, blood from more than just one generous donor. With college & university students away on vacation, and regular donors getting involved with outdoor activities and spring routines, May becomes a challenging month for Canadian Blood Services.

Your support during this challenging time helps keep up with hospital demand. Last year, Windsor hospitals were issued close to 9,000 units of blood to help hospital patients in the Windsor/Essex community.

There are 32 whole blood permanent collection sites across Canada and Windsor is home to one. Every week, 375 blood donors are needed to meet our weekly collection targets. For 2018/19, the Windsor blood collection site has a new donor target of 2,725 in order to maintain a healthy donor base.

Let's ensure it is a success and support patients in need of blood and/or blood products! Canadian Blood Services also encourages departments to arrange groups to donate as a team of three or more people. Some steps to organizing a blood drive are:

- Decide how many appointments you want to try to fill.
- Decide what date and time is most convenient for your team.
- Canadian Blood Services will reserve those times and send you an electronic sign-up sheet, along with eligibility requirements and promotional materials.
- A couple of days before your team's donation date send in the sign-up sheet with the list of individuals interested in donating. We can add/remove appointments as necessary.

Come to the clinic, enjoy the company & snacks - and save lives together!

Hours for the Windsor Blood Donor Clinic, located at 3909 Grand Marais Road are as follows:

- Monday, 3 pm to 7 pm
- Tuesday, 3 pm to 7 pm - Wednesday, 3 pm to 7 pm
- Thursday, 11:30 am to 7:30 pm
- Friday, 8 am to noon
- Saturday, 8 am to noon

Strawberry Broccoli Salad with Creamy Poppy Seed Dressing

Makes 6-8 servings Preparation: 15 min

INGREDIENTS

- Strawberry Broccoli Salad
- 5 cups chopped broccoli florets
- 1 1/2 cups chopped strawberries
- 1/4 cup diced red onion
- 1 pear, chopped
- 1 sweet apple, like Fuji, chopped
- 1 large Avocado, chopped - 1/2 cup sunflower seeds

Creamy Poppy Seed Dressing

1/2 cup vanilla Greek yogurt (I use nonfat)

- 1/2 cup real mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1-2 tablespoons sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon red wine vinegar

- 1/3 cup crumbled feta

- 1 tablespoon poppy seeds
 - 1/8 teaspoon pepper

DIRECTIONS

Add all of the Salad Ingredients to a large bowl except avocados. In a separate medium bowl, whisk together the Dressing ingredients. Add desired amount of Dressing to Salad and toss until evenly coated. Best if chilled for at least 30 minutes up to overnight. Toss with avocados just before serving.
