Ronald McDonald House Windsor Celebrates 2nd Birthday

The uniqueness about the Ronald McDonald House at Windsor Regional Hospital is that it is the first of its kind within a hospital, located on 3 West at the Met Campus. Since in opening in May, 2016, it has served many local and regional families while their ill child received care.

Some of the most recent statistics indicate:

- · 66% of families stayed last year to be close to their premature infants
- · 224 families kept close to their seriously ill child
- · 3,252 nights of comfort, with average stay of 14 nights received
- · Longest stay by a family was 102 nights
- · 150 families supported through Day Pass Program
- \cdot 9,052 total visits made by families with children in hospital for care
- · 156 loads of laundry done
- · 538 meals prepared and served
- · 273 meals donated by restaurants
- · 33 baking groups made fresh cookies, etc.
- · and, thank you to the Heart volunteers for making 609 meals

Hamid's Wish Comes True

The Make-A-Wish Foundation is there when children are battling a critical illness and much of their childhood is taken away from them. Families are exhausted, both emotionally and physically due to the challenge their child is experiencing.

Hamid, a sickle cell patient and his family are new immigrants to Windsor and receiving care in Paediatric Services. As a way to make Hamid's life a little better, Child Life Services worked with the Make-A-Wish Foundation to plan a special wish for Hamid. He was surprised when coming in for a client visit recently, being made an honourary doctor for the day and, going on a scavenger hunt to locate several electronic devices he did not have or could afford.

The end result was an array of gifts, such as a flat screen television, PS4 game, cell phone and more, made possible by the Make-A-Wish Foundation.

"A wish is something that gives children the opportunity to look outside their illness and restores a sense of childhood in them and some normalcy back into the family," stated Misha Medeiros, Officer with Wish Partnerships.

Regional HIS Transformation Project

What is the Regional HIS Transformation Project?

The five hospitals in the Erie St. Clair (ESC) region – WRH, Hôtel-Dieu Grace Healthcare, Chatham-Kent Health Alliance, Erie Shores Healthcare and Bluewater Health - currently all operate their own hospital information systems (HIS). This project is about implementing a single, common HIS across the region so we are equipped with state-of-the-art technology to deliver high-quality, safe care to our patients.

Across Erie St. Clair, we are now collectively ready to work together and make this new system a reality.

Why are we doing this and why now?

Collectively, our technology is out-of-date and modern HIS solutions are key enablers to delivering safer, higher-quality care. This ESC clinical transformation will build upon the province's unified patient record strategy for the region, and create an all-around better experience for patients and staff alike. A regional approach to HIS is not only rooted in leading practice, but is also aligned with the mandate recently released by the provincial government which encourages hospitals to partner together and create shared HIS solutions – our Regional HIS Transformation Project is part of the vision for a more collaborative, coordinated, and connected health system across the province.

How will this impact my job?

The new system will change how some of us do our work, but comprehensive training efforts will be provided to ensure we are ready and prepared to hit the ground running.

When will I see changes to the systems in my hospital?

The first hospital go-live is expected to take place in Spring/ Summer 2019, with the rest of the hospitals going live between then and the end of 2021.

What will this project be called?

A recent naming competition included 55 naming entries from across the region. Six have been short-listed and will be voted on at a large upcoming regional workshop that will include all five ESC LHIN hospitals as well as TransForm. Once the name is established look for more communications about this project over the weeks that follow.

Curried Potato Salad

Makes 10 servings Preparation: 15 min Cooking Time: 15



INGREDIENTS


- 2½ pounds yellow or red potatoes, scrubbed and diced (½- to 1-inch)
- 3/4 teaspoon salt, divided
- ½ cup mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup low-fat plain yogurt
- 1/4 cup finely chopped onion
- 2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 2-3 teaspoons curry powder½ teaspoon ground pepper
- 1 medium red bell pepper, chopped
- 34 cup frozen peas, thawed

DIRECTIONS

Bring 1 to 2 inches of water to a boil in a large saucepan (or pot) fitted with a steamer basket. Add potatoes, cover and cook until tender, 12 to 15 minutes. Spread in a single layer on a rimmed baking sheet and sprinkle with ¼ teaspoon salt; let cool 15 minutes. Meanwhile, whisk mayonnaise, yogurt, onion, mustard, curry powder to taste, pepper and the remaining ½ teaspoon salt in a large bowl. Add the potatoes, bell pepper and peas; stir well to coat. Serve at room temperature or refrigerate until cold. Make Ahead Tip: Cover and refrigerate for up to 1 day.
