Stroke Awareness Month - Know The Risks!

June is Stroke Awareness Month, an opportunity to spread the word about the risk factors and how to prevent a stroke from occurring. A stroke is a sudden loss of brain function caused by a sudden brain blood vessel blockage (ischemic stroke) or rupture (hemorrhagic stroke). Ischemic stroke is the most common type of stroke.

Posters around the hospital list the main risks:

- High blood pressure
- Smoking
- Diabetes
- High blood cholesterol
- Atrial fibrillation ("Afib")

How do you prevent a stroke?

- Keep blood pressure under control
- Be physically active
- Maintain a healthy diet
- Quit Smoking

District Stroke Centre Team - Who We are? What We do?

As part of Stroke Awareness Month, we are highlighting the members of the WRH team dedicated to improving the lives of patients in our community when it comes to this issue.

As the designated Enhanced District Stroke Centre for Windsor and Essex County, WRH's District Stroke Centre team and its partners work collaboratively with many local organizations and disciplines to plan and implement strategies for improving stroke care in response to local, regional and provincial identified needs and priorities. Dr. Michael Winger is Medical Director and Karen Riddell is the Administrative Lead.

Denise St. Louis, District Stroke Coordinator: Denise's role is to provide leadership across the continuum to support best practice and integrated service to patients and their families. She works closely with the Regional Stroke Network and is the provincial representative at CorHealth Ontario for Windsor Essex.

Sandra Rebner, Stroke Prevention Nurse: Sandy's responsibilities include triaging referrals in the Urgent TIA Clinic, preparing patients for diagnostic tests, arranging vascular and interventional radiology consults and patient and family education. She also ensures patients have appropriate community rehab, supports and services, and is the link with primary care.

Rachel Holmes, Acute Stroke Resource Nurse: Rachel's responsibilities include facilitating acute best practice stroke care, patient and family education, best practice guideline implementa- Prevention Nurse Rachel Holmes, Acute Stroke Resource tion, data collection, professional education and acute process improvement.

Selected individuals will be notified by June 20, 2018.



#RECIPEOFTHEWEEK

Broccoli Salad With Bacon

Makes 5 servings Preparation: 15 min

INGREDIENTS

- ½ cup mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon whole-grain mustard
- 1 tablespoon cider vinegar
- 1 small clove garlic, grated
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon ground pepper
- 4 cups finely chopped broccoli crowns
- 1 cup finely chopped cauliflower
- 1/4 cup finely chopped red onion
- 3 slices cooked bacon, chopped (1/4 cup)
- 3 tablespoons sunflower seeds, toasted

DIRECTIONS

Whisk mayonnaise, mustard, vinegar, garlic, sugar and pepper in a large bowl. Add broccoli, cauliflower, onion, bacon and sunflower seeds. Stir to coat. To make ahead: Refrigerate for up to 1 day.
