However, sometimes there are adverse effects to receiving care — unintended harm associated with the delivery of care that can result in a prolonged hospital stay, disability or death. For the fourth time in 2018, Windsor Regional Hospital has achieved a "0" Harm Index. A Zero Harm index measures a number of preventable harms that occur in hospitals such as falls, health-acquired infections and irreplaceable lab specimens.

This remarkable achievement occurred again in May 2018 at the Met Campus. All those involved in patient care at every level should be proud of this achievement.

#RECIPEOFTHEWEEK

Rhubarb Crisp

Makes 6-8 servings
Preparation: 15 min
Cooking Time: 75 min



Ingredients

- 1 cup large-flake oats
- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 3/4 tsp salt
- 1/2 cup cold unsalted butter, cubed

Filling:

- 6 cups chopped rhubarb, cut into 1-inch pieces (about 760 g)
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1/3 cup cornstarch
- 2 tbsps water

Directions

POSITION rack in lower third of oven and preheat to 350F.

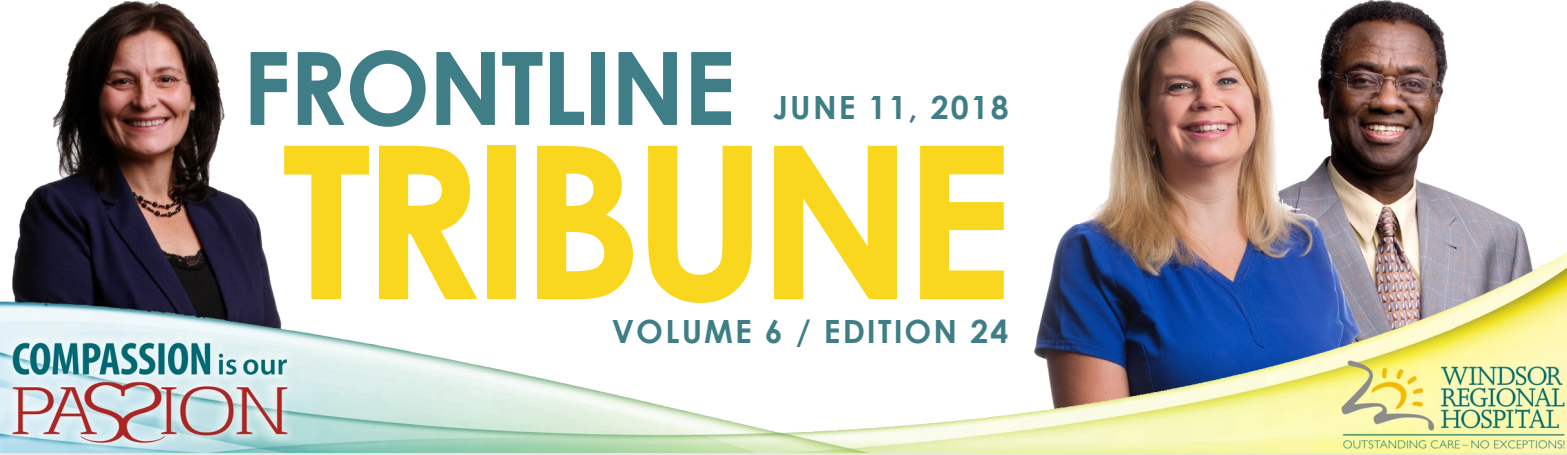
TOPPING: Stir oats, flour, brown sugar and salt in a bowl. Add butter and work in, using your fingertips, until crumbly. Refrigerate until ready to use.

FILLING: Toss rhubarb, sugar, cornstarch and water in a large bowl, stirring until cornstarch is absorbed. Let sit 5 min and stir again. Transfer to a 9 x 13-in. glass baking dish.

SPRINKLE oat mixture evenly over rhubarb. Bake in lower third of oven until top is golden and juices are bubbling around edges and through the top of crisp, about 1 hour. Let cool completely. Serve with ice cream.

The Mackenzie Tour PGA (Professional Golf Association) Canada is coming to Windsor's Ambassador Golf Club from July 2nd to the 8th and giving young golfers, 19 years and under an opportunity to participate in a round of golf with a Pro during the Pro-Am tournament.

The Windsor Regional Hospital Foundation has partnered with Mackenzie Tour PGA Canada to promote and select individuals to enter a competition and participate in the event simply by going to the website, www.wrhgolfgpa.ca and, in their own words, express why they want to participate in this, once in a life time chance to golf with a Pro.

The Mackenzie Tour PGA Canada is supporting the Hospice of Windsor-Essex. WRHF is supporting the Women's and Children's Program. The opportunity for three individuals, 19 years of age and younger to enter the competition by submitting on-line why they want to participate in the Mackenzie Tour is available now through June 15, 2018. All applicants must meet the criteria and if not selected to golf, will still receive free passes to attend and watch the tour. Fifteen individuals who have submitted on line can participate in a Junior Demonstration on July 7th and in the Junior Clinic on July 8th at Ambassador Golf Club with a Pro.



Go to www.wrhgolfgpa.ca now through June 15th to enter. Your child must be 19 years of age or younger by July 1, 2018 and be a resident in the tri-county region. They must have parental consent and have their photograph taken during the tournament.

Selected individuals will be notified by June 20, 2018.

The Paul Harris Fellowship Award is one of the highest honours Rotary can bestow upon a person. Recipients can be Rotarians and also community professionals, in recognition of their outstanding contributions.

David Musyj, President and Chief Executive Officer for Windsor Regional Hospital was a recent inductee, receiving a Paul Harris Fellow recognition at last week's Rotary Club of Windsor Roseland meeting. Paul Harris was the very first Rotarian, having called together two associates when he first moved to Chicago, Illinois, seeking fellowship in a new city. From the gathering, Mr. Harris and his friends formed the first of what has become Rotary International around the world. Rotary's motto became 'Service Above Self' and still stands today and the creed of all Rotarians.

The Paul Harris Fellow recognition was established in 1957 to show appreciation for and encourage substantial contributions to what was then, the Rotary Foundation's only program. David Musyj joins such notables whom have received a Paul Harris Fellowship including, entertainer, Pearl Bailey, U.S. President, Jimmy Carter, U.S. Astronaut, James Lovell, Scientist, Jonas Salk and Russian President, Boris Yeltsin.

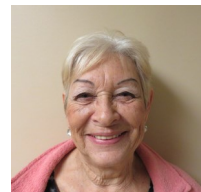

Use of Additional Precaution Signs



Only indicate the type of Additional Precautions in place, including the PPE required

- Precautions signs must maintain the confidentiality of the patient – Do not indicate "MRSA", "VRE", "Cdiff", "ARO CONTACT", "R/O" etc.

Here are 2 acceptable ways document Additional Precautions for specific bed-spaces:



When a patient is transferred - leave the Additional Precautions sign up for housekeeping, and ensure a new sign is hung in the new room.

When a patient is discharged - leave the sign up for housekeeping - this may change how they treat the space and also allows them to follow the proper PPE during cleaning



TIP: Alcohol wipes appear to be best for removal of washable marker from signs
