Sriracha Marmalade Glazed Salmon

Makes 4 servings Preparation Time: 10 min Prep Time: 20 min

1 teaspoon coarse kosher salt 4 4-ounce portions boneless skinless salmon filet 1 teaspoon avocado oil 1/4 cup orange marmalade 1 tablespoon Sriracha



Preheat oven to 425 degrees F. Sprinkle salt all over the salmon.

Heat a large oven-proof skillet (preferably cast iron) over medium-high heat. Add oil and brush over the bottom of the skillet with a heat proof pastry brush. When oil is very hot, lay salmon in the skillet, skinned side-down and let cook undisturbed until the bottom is browned and the fish releases easily from the hot skillet, 3 to 4 minutes.

Meanwhile, stir marmalade and Sriracha in a small bowl.

Carefully flip fish over and spoon the marmalade mixture over the fish. Transfer the skillet to the oven and let continue cooking until the fish is just barely opaque in the center, 2 to 4 minutes for medium-well. Serve hot.

CATH LAB UPDATE

As of March 26th the Cardiac Cath Lab has been working with the new upgraded Philips Clarity FD10 series table that has seen a 70% radiation reduction compared to the old table that was installed in 2005.

The previous table was at its end of life and had become unreliable with various issues that would cause us to close the lab for maintenance. With only having one table and having over 2500 procedures performed yearly, it was a well used table. With this upgraded system, we can be assured that the Cath Lab table is reliable, has newer technology for patient's imaging and less radiation exposure for patients and staff working in the room.

The monitor is a 58 inch LED monitor that has integrated systems that add value to our patients by providing us

with more useful diagnostic tools that can assist in making decisions about treatment and options. The C Arm has the ability to rotate 180 degrees and provides real time 3D impressions of the coronary anatomy with one injection, thereby reducing the amount of contrast dye the patient receives.



The physicians and nurses have noticed the improvements that this new table has offered and we were able to revamp the actual physical space to make it more functional and less cluttered.

Overall we can now continue to provide this essential Cardiac service to the patients within our community and LHIN without the fear of our old table shutting
