From January through May, 2018, Middle East respiratory syndrome coronavirus (MERS-CoV) was responsible for four clusters totaling 75 cases of disease in Saudi Arabia, twenty-three of which resulted in the death of the patient. Two of the clusters were healthcare-associated.

Ryan's Case For Smiles

Ryan's Case for Smiles (formerly ConKerr Cancer) was founded in 2007 to bring comfort and support to young patients and their families in hospitals around the world. It started with a simple goal, to create and distribute whimsical and colorful pillowcases that give children an emotional boost and remind them that they are not defined by their illness. The program has expanded where there are more than 120 chapters with over 50,000 children helped annually by more than 40 million volunteer hours donated and 1,700,000 million pillowcases delivered..

Ryan Kerr, the inspiration behind the initiative battled cancer for years, first diagnosed with Osteoscarcoma at age 12, fighting through five cancer recurrences, 30 months of chemotherapy, 15 surgeries, the amputation of his right leg and over 150 days of physical therapy. Ryan's sickness never slowed him down from living the active and adventurous life he loved. He constantly challenged himself with new things, skiing, biking, skateboarding, rock climbing, scuba diving, and cycling. Through his illness, he managed to stay engaged in his school studies and graduate from high school. As a young man, he learned to be deeply compassionate, thoughtful, wicked wit, a winning smile and gave the world's best hugs. Most of all, Ryan lived his life with such joy and courage that he inspired thousands of people. His memory will always be remembered through the Case for Smiles program.

The local chapter of Ryan's Case for Smiles is based in Chatham, Ontario. The group has donated pillowcases since 2012. The latest donation indicates over 5,000 presented to Paediatric Services at Windsor Regional Hospital.

#RECIPEOFTHEWEEK

Shrimp Tacos

Makes: 6 servings; 2 each

Preparation: 45 min/Cooking Time: 5 min



INGREDIENTS

- 1-1/2 cups shredded cabbage - 1/2 cup red onion

- 1/2 bunch cilantro

- 1 garlic clove

- 1 pd fresh shrimp, medium-size - 1/2 tsp ground cumin

- 1/2 tsp chili powder

- 2 limes

- 2 tbsp olive oil - 1/4 cup sour cream - 1/2 cup mayonnaise

- 2 tablespoons milk

- 12 corn tortillas, 6-inch size

DIRECTIONS

Shred the cabbage; chop the onion and cilantro; mince the garlic. Set aside. Shell and devein the shrimp then place in a dish and squeeze lime juice from half a lime over shrimp. Sprinkle with minced garlic, cumin, chili powder and 1 tablespoon of the olive oil. Turn shrimp to coat with marinade and refrigerate for 15 to 30 minutes. Make the salsa blanca by combining mayonnaise, sour cream, milk and juice of half a lime. Stir to combine and place in the refrigerator to chill. In a large skillet heat the remaining 1 tablespoon of olive oil over medium-high heat. Add shrimp and cook and stir 2 to 4 minutes until shrimp turns pink. Remove shrimp from skillet. Do not overcook. Heat the corn tortillas, one by one, in a pan, until soft and warm. Wrap them in a clean dish towel to keep them warm until ready to serve tacos. To assemble tacos place 4 shrimp on each tortilla and top with salsa blanca, cabbage, red onion, cilantro and lime wedges. Add hot sauce if desired.
