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Zoning Approved! – Another Step Forward For The Windsor-Essex Hospitals System

Patients in Windsor-Essex are a step closer to the state-of-the-art, modern, healthcare they deserve. On August 13th, Windsor City Council and the Planning Heritage and Economic Development Standing Committee voted to approve the hospital's zoning applications. Thank you to all who added a voice to the discussion that lasted over 8.5 hours in City Hall Chambers.

A special thanks to Windsor City Council and the Standing Committee for their leadership and support. The final vote by councillors was 8 in favour, with 2 opposed; therefore passed successfully.

The joint public meeting was to determine how the area around the new future hospital will develop over the next 20 years and beyond, and how the new hospital can be accommodated on the selected site, During the meeting, City Planner and Executive Director, Thom Hunt said the plan meets Provincial and Municipal requirements and "makes good planning sense".

In making their decision, several City of Windsor Councillors commented on the significance of the vote and what it means for healthcare in our region.

"Tonight is a big step forward for better healthcare for everyone in Windsor-Essex," stated Mayor Drew Dilkens. "We're talking about a regional hospital, or no hospital at all. I want a \$2 billion investment in my community. I think people deserve better healthcare."

This is another important milestone in the region's journey toward a new world class hospital system for Windsor-Essex.

Major Milestones:

November 2012: Task Force recommends moving forward with a new single-site acute care hospital for Windsor-Essex.

October 2013: Historic Realignment of Hospital Services between Windsor Regional Hospital and Hôtel-Dieu Grace Healthcare.

July 2015: Volunteer Site Selection Sub-Committee recommends site for new hospital at County Road 42 and 9th Concession and, Windsor-Essex Hospitals System Plan announced.

April 2016: City of Windsor Council and Essex County Council approve a levy of \$200 million to cover the local 10% share of the 'bricks and mortar' portion.

November 2017: Infrastructure Ontario (IO) appointed to lead the procurement process for construction of the new acute care hospital. A Request for Qualifications (RFQ) scheduled to be issued in 2021, subject to change.

Zoning Approved Cont'd

December 2017: Minister of Health and Long-Term Care, The Honourable Eric Hoskins (Government of the Day) visits Windsor and the Ouellette Campus, commits to moving the project to Stage 2.

August 2018: Zoning applications approved by Windsor City Council.

"We are expecting and prepared for opponents to the plan to file for appeal and hopefully that moves along quickly;" said David Musyj, President and CEO of Windsor Regional Hospital and Co-Chair of the Steering Committee overseeing plans for the new Windsor-Essex Hospitals System. "I think it is going to be very difficult on any grounds of appeal though. It is a very solid plan, in the best interest of the city, with conservative projections with respect to numbers. I expect the appeal will be quick and we can go ahead and close on the property."

In the meantime, Windsor Regional Hospital and the Steering Committee, overseeing plans for the Windsor Essex Hospitals System will continue to work with the Erie St. Clair Local Health Integration Network and the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care on details of a plan that will best meet the needs of patients in the region.

The new Windsor-Essex Hospitals System will:

- · Offer patient and family-centred care,
- · Improve patient safety and privacy,
- · Assist to retain and recruit top healthcare professionals,
- · Include a Satellite Urgent Care Centre in the City's core,
- · Not result in the removal of all healthcare services from the City's core,
- · Not result in a reduction of beds,
- · Not result in the closure of Erie Shores Healthcare in Learnington, and
- · Improve communication between patients, staff and the system.


The e-VOLVE project has numerous potential benefits



Summer Plum Salsa
