The event is co-hosted by Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry alumnus, Dr. John Day, and the new Regional Primary Care Lead for the Erie St. Clair Regional Cancer Program, Dr. Tamara Siddall. Dr. Siddall said the event provides a warm welcome to the community for these future physicians.

"This is a fun and interactive way for students to get to know each other, and for those joining the Schulich Medicine – Windsor Campus from outside our region, to get to know the city," Dr. Siddall said. "But most importantly, it will educate these students, as well as help raise public awareness about the importance of cancer screening and prevention." Since inception four years ago, almost 100 medical students have participated in this event.



#RECIPEOFTHEWEEK

Turkey Apple Brie Sandwiches

Makes 4 servings / Preparation: 20 min

INGREDIENTS

- 1 Granny Smith apple, thinly sliced
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1 whole-wheat baguette (8 ounces)
- 4 leaves red leaf lettuce
- 4 ounces shredded cooked turkey breast
- 2 ounces Brie cheese, thinly sliced
- 4 teaspoons Dijon mustard

DIRECTIONS

Toss apple slices and lemon juice in a small bowl. Cut baguette crosswise into 4 sections. Cut each section in half lengthwise. Remove the soft inner portion of bread, leaving a ¼-inch-thick shell. (Reserve the inner bread for another use) Top the bottom pieces of bread with lettuce, turkey, Brie and the apple slices. Spread mustard on the top pieces and set one on each sandwich. Serve immediately or wrap and refrigerate for up to 4 bours.
