Leukemia, Lymphoma And Myeloma Awareness Month

The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society of Canada was founded in Toronto in 1955 by five women concerned with the lack of focus on leukemia research. They raised money for research and the first Provincial charter for the City of Hope Leukemia Fighters was issued in 1957. The focus of the group was to raise funds for Canadian hospitals affiliated with cancer care.

In 1965, the official name was changed to Toronto Leukemia Fighters. This was also the first year all funds raised were donated to Mount Sinai Hospital which invested heavily in leukemia and related blood disorders.

In 1972, the organization's name changed again to the Leukemia Research Fund. In 1983, another organization with a similar mission, the Crusade Against Leukemia, amalgamated with the Leukemia Research Fund. The organization expanded outside of Toronto over the next few years. The Leukemia Research Fund of Canada became a registered charity in 1992.

Similar to what was done in the United States, the official name change became The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society of Canada. The Canada organization is a separate entity focused on funding Canadian research and supporting Canadians in need as they go through their cancer journey.

The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society of Canada is a voluntary health agency dedicated to blood cancers. It provides free information and support services to patients and caregivers. Its mission: Cure leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkin's disease and myeloma, and improve the quality of life of patients and their families,

A commitment to cutting-edge science has contributed to an unprecedented rise in survival rates for some people with blood cancers. The relative five-year survival rate for people with leukemia nearly quadrupled in the past 48 years. Hodgkin lymphoma is now considered one of the most curable forms of cancer, thanks to radiation and chemotherapy.

The Windsor Regional Cancer Program provides My Cancer Guide, an online education tool for patients and families attending the Cancer Centre. The Windsor Cancer Foundation funds the guide for patients affected with lung, colorectal, prostate, breast and melanoma cancers.

According to a recent study, Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis) vaccination for pregnant women does not increase risk of autism. Of the 81,993 children studied, 1.5% whose mothers were vaccinated had a diagnosis of autism, compared to 1.8% of unvaccinated mothers. This compares to the estimated prevalence of autism of 1.7%.





#RECIPEOFTHEWEEK Rainbow Frittata

Makes 4 servinas Preparation: 30 min

INGREDIENTS

- Nonstick cooking spray
- 1/4 cup 1/2-inch pieces sweet potato
- 1/4 cup 1/2-inch pieces yellow sweet pepper
- 1/4 cup coarsely chopped fresh broccoli
- 1 teaspoon snipped fresh basil
- ½ teaspoon snipped fresh thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/18 teaspoon cracked black pepper
- 1 avocado, halved, seeded, peeled and thinly sliced
- 5½ cups grape or cherry tomatoes, halved
- Sriracha sauce

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 350 F. Coat an oven proof 10-inch nonstick skillet with cooking spray. Add sweet potato, sweet pepper and broccoli; cook and stir over medium 5 to 7 minutes or until tender. In a medium bowl whisk together eggs, basil, thyme, salt and black pepper. Pour mixture over vegetables in skillet. Cook, without stirring, until mixture begins to set on bottom and around edges. Using a spatula, lift egg mixture so uncooked portion flows underneath. Transfer skillet to oven; cook 5 minutes or until ega mixture is set. Remove from oven. Let stand 2 minutes. Top servings with avocado and tomatoes. Drizzle with sriracha.
