KRONOS IS COMING...Starting at 11:00 p.m. Friday, September 25 for the Met Campus

It is a major change in the payroll system for staff at the Met Campus. Kronos is about creating one payroll system and extending the use of a "card swipe" (electronic swipe system) for Met Campus staff along with upgrading the existing system at the Ouellette Campus. As of September 26, 2015 and the effective pay date of October 1, 2015, all staff at Windsor Regional Hospital (Ouellette and Met Campus) will be under one payroll system!

Please note that the change to "swipe card" for the Met Campus employees for the Kronos time and attendance system will take place, for any incoming shifts at 11:00 p.m. shift on Friday, September 25, 2015, outgoing shifts up to 7am Saturday morning will not be required to swipe out. Staff will be required to clock in, using the time clocks in place at the Met Campus when they arrive and leave for their scheduled shifts. Staff and/or volunteers will be present throughout the weekend of the 26th to assist any staff with the new process.

Your Department Manager will be distributing prox (swipe) cards to all Met staff this week for Kronos use. The current swipe cards utilized for access are **NOT** compatible with Kronos and therefore, all staff will require two (2) swipe cards, one for access and one for Kronos. Each employee will be assigned their own swipe card which can not be used by others!

Mango Chicken Wraps

Mango Chicken Wraps / Makes 4 Servings Preparation: 10 min

INGREDIENTS

- 1/4 cup Light Mayonnaise
- (4) 10 inch Multigrain Tortillas
- (1) Mango, sliced
- 4 cups Loosely packed mesclun mix
- 1/4 cup Mango Chutney
- 8oz Cooked Chicken, cut into strips
- 1/4 Red Onion, cut into thin rings

METHOD

In a small bowl, combine mayonnaise and chutney. Spread 2 tbsp (25 mL) of the mayonnaise mixture on each tortilla. On the bottom third of each tortilla, place one-quarter of each of the chicken strips, mango slices, red onion rings and mesclun mix. Fold the 2 sides, then fold the bottom of the wrap up over the filling and roll until tight. Tip: You can use leftover cooked chicken, or purchase a cooked chicken from the grocery store.
