VIBE 2.0 Coming To Met Campus! Ouellette Campus Updated to 2.0!

On Wednesday November 4th, Windsor Regional Hospital will be launching the VIBE 2.0 program at the Metropolitan campus. VIBE is a program that combines data from various programs already in use in the organization and allows individuals to track, measure, and view each patient's journey in real-time so actionable decisions can be made when they matter. Confidentiality is maintained because no patient names are displayed. Information can be viewed in CITRIX and also on Mobile devices with a WRH IP address.

The original VIBE has been in place at the Ouellette Campus since June 2012 and has been used to manage patient flow throughout the Ouellette campus. VIBE at Ouellette will be upgraded to the newest 2.0 version (same version that Met is launching) on Wednesday, November 4th also.

For those requiring general viewing of the VIBE, the VIBE icon will be found in Citrix in the Clinicals folder. There will be 2 icons displaying VIBE that distinguish between Met and Ouellette.

Once you select the icon the program will open directly into the Guest view. If you do not have a Clinicals folder in Citrix and would like VIBE loaded onto your Citrix profile with a usename and password, you will need to call the Transform Helpdesk at ext. 7771.

The VIBE program provides a snapshot of the current status at both campuses. There may be a lag time to allow the data to be pulled from the various programs and for the VIBE program to be updated. For example the Dashboard is updated every 5 minutes, ALCs are updated every hour. Therefore, there may be a discrepancy in numbers during this time as it is updating. Please keep this in mind when viewing VIBE.

WRH uses at least two client identifiers before providing any services or procedures

What We Do at WRH:

WRH staff use at least 2 patient identifiers before providing every service or procedure.

WRH has implemented many improvements to help ensure this happens:

- Standardization of patient identification bands at both sites to ensure all patients receive identification, which is legible and stays on the patient.
- 2by4 awareness campaign targeted to staff and visitors.
- RL6 reporting for any wrong patient identification with follow-up, root cause analysis, and trending and rates (reviewed in safety indicator reports to MMH and Clinical Red Green).
- Leadership rounding audits.
- WRH documentation includes patient identifiers (ie transfer of accountability form, Blood component tool, & irreplaceable specimen checklist).
- Patient Identification Policy and department specific policies.
- Information is provided in orientation with all new hires and also highlighted as part of performance of procedures including medication administration and IV therapy.

Period Of Purple Crying Alerts Parents About Shaken Baby Syndrome

November is designated as the month to remind parents about shaken baby syndrome and how harmful it is to their infant or newborn. The Period of Purple Crying campaign was designed throughout North America to educate families that babies are fragile and continuous crying at times from their infant is normal.

Dealing with a crying baby can be very difficult and parents often do not realize just how frustrating it is until they are in a stressful situation. No one ever thinks they will shake their infant however, research shows crying as the number one reason leading to parents or caregivers violently shaking and injuring their baby.

Every parent giving birth at Windsor Regional Hospital in the Family Birthing Centre is provided with information regarding the Period of Purple Crying. A video teaches new parents ways to comfort their baby and important steps to take when the crying continues and frustrates them. It indicates why shaking a baby is harmful! Parents are encouraged to speak to other new parents about how important it is to understand consistent crying and why it is alright. In addition, local community knitters provide purple warming newborn caps.

The Period of Purple Crying is a collaborative effort among healthcare partners in the community and include the Windsor Essex Health Unit; VON; Windsor Essex Community Care Centre; Midwives of Windsor, EMS and area hospitals.

Potato-Apple Latkes

Makes 8 Servings; 2 each Preparation: 30 min Cooking Time: 15 - 30 min

INGREDIENTS

- 6 cups shredded Yukon gold potatoes
- 2 cups shredded apples
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt, divided
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
- ½ cup all-purpose flour
- 6 tablespoons canola oil, divided
- 1 teaspoon granulated sugar



METHOD

Combine potatoes, apples, and 1 teaspoon salt in a colander. Let stand 20 minutes, pressing occasionally with the back of a spoon until barely moist. Combine potato mixture, remaining 1/2 teaspoon salt, and pepper in a large bowl. Weigh or lightly spoon flour into a dry measuring cup; level with a knife. Add flour to potato mixture; toss well to combine. Heat a 12-inch nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. Add 1 1/2 tablespoons oil to pan, swirling to coat. Add potato mixture in 1/3-cupfuls to pan to form 4 latkes; flatten slightly. Cook 6 minutes on each side or until golden brown. Remove latkes from pan; keep warm. Repeat procedure 3 more times with remaining oil and potato mixture. Sprinkle latkes evenly with sugar.
