IN THIS WEEK'S ISSUE Make Your IT Idea A Reality At Hacking Health!

Got an idea for a health app or medical device? Want to join 250 creative American and Canadian professionals from the health and IT sectors in a weekend of inspiring and innovative cross-border collaboration?

WEtech Alliance, TechTown Detroit and the EPICentre are accepting registration for the 2nd annual Hacking Health Windsor Detroit, which takes place in the Anthony P. Toldo Health Education Centre at the University of Windsor, May 13-15, 2016.

WRH and other local health care partners are sponsoring the event that is an open invitation to health care professionals, information technology experts and others - everyone from doctors, nurses, allied health professionals, administrators, computer programmers, graphic designers, technology companies, students and investors. They'll come together over the course of a weekend to form teams that dream up, design and build mobile apps and IT solutions for the health care sector.

Last year more than 35 ideas were pitched and over \$30,000 in prizes were awarded. WRH's Kaitlyn Sheehan (Clinical Practice Manager, Cardiac Catheterization Lab, Cardiac Care Unit & Diagnostic Imaging) was one of last year's award winners for her idea for an app called "Stent Tracker." Named the Judges' Overall Favourite and the idea with the Highest Potential For Adoption, the web-based app would allow patients to store their cardiac stent information, manage their medication list, schedule reminders when to take their meds and provide education on heart health and coronary angioplasty.

"I had this idea and I didn't really know who to call, what to do with it, how to take it to the next level," Kaitlyn told the Windsor Star this month about the experience, where she arrived alone to pitch her idea but soon was able to partner with IT experts to help her develop the concept.

Last year's inaugural Hacking Health was held at TechTown and brought together over 250 participants who pitched more than 20 groundbreaking ideas.

- You don't have to be part of a team to register nor do you have to have an idea formulated, you can show up and join a team at the event. Bring your skills and an open mind.

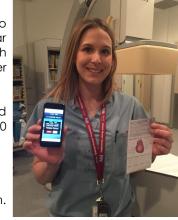

NATIONAL HEALTH ETHICS WEEK **APRIL 4 - 11, 2016**

National Health Ethics Week (April 4th to 11th, 2016) is a time set aside for health and educational institutions, ethics committees, health care professionals, community organizations, businesses and members of the general public, to raise awareness of ethics issues related to health and health care across Canada.

The Windsor Regional Hospital (WRH) Ethics committee acts as an advisory committee on matters related to hospital ethics and to promote awareness and education regarding ethical decision making. The committee advises on policies and procedures with ethical implications for patient care within the Corporation.

The mandate of the Research Ethics Board (REB) is to safeguard the rights, safety and well-being of all research participants in the hospital. The REB reviews, approves and maintains continuing oversight of the conduct of a research project. Research must meet ethical and scientific standards.

To promote participation in National Ethics Week, a 'lunch and learn' will be held and there is an opportunity for all staff to participate in a guiz on the subject of Ethics. Visit the WRH website for more information and an opportunity to win a Chapters Gift Card.

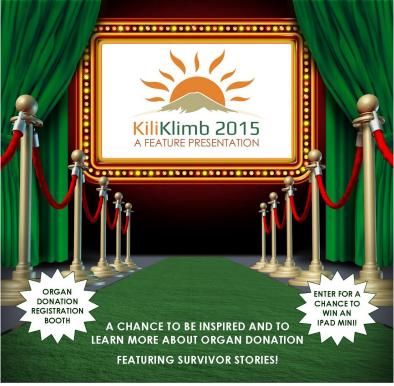

Mental Wellness Speaker Series

Please join Brian Knowler and his wife Cathy as they discuss mental wellness and PTSD in first responders and their families. Brian is a 17 year member of law enforcement. Cathy is a teacher, principal, adult educator and has been part of the policing family her whole life.



In 2004, Brian was the first responder to the scene of a motor vehicle collision that took the life of the driver. a close friend from university. He buried the memories and effects of that night and hid himself in work, promotions, and isolation from his friends and family.

Finally, in 2012, the dam broke and Brian began seeking treatment for his diagnosed PTSD. He was immediately 'out of the closet' about his PTSD and made it a priority to inform both his officers and the public about the prevalence of PTSD in policing. This has included media interviews, taking part in panel presentations, and lecturing to college classes and policing groups.

Brian firmly believes that his family has been the key to his recovery and success and that the journey through trauma can be one of rediscovery and rebuilding.

PTSD needs to be dragged into the light, not hidden away in the shadows!
