


Make Your IT Idea A Reality At Hacking Health

Got an idea for a health app or medical device? Want to join 250 creative American and Canadian professionals from the health and IT sectors in a weekend of inspiring and innovative cross-border collaboration?

WEtech Alliance, TechTown Detroit and the EPICentre are accepting registrations for the 2nd annual Hacking Health Windsor Detroit, which takes place in the Anthony P. Toldo Health Education Centre at the University of Windsor, May 13-15, 2016.

WRH and other local health care partners are sponsoring the event that is an open invitation to health care professionals, information technology experts and others – everyone from doctors, nurses, allied health



Last year more than 35 ideas were pitched and over \$30,000 in prizes were awarded. WRH's Kaitlyn Sheehan (Clinical Practice Manager, Cardiac Catheterization Lab, Cardiac Care Unit & Diagnostic Imaging) was one of last year's award winners for her idea for an app called "Stent Tracker." Named the Judges' Overall Favourite and the idea with the Highest Potential For Adoption, the web-based app would allow patients to store their cardiac stent information, manage their medication list, schedule reminders when to take their meds and provide education on heart health and coronary anaioplasty.

"I had this idea and I didn't really know who to call, what to do with it, how to take it to the next level," Kaitlyn told the Windsor Star this month about the experience, where she arrived alone to pitch her idea but soon was able to partner with IT experts to help her develop the concept.


Last year's inaugural Hacking Health was held at TechTown and brought together over 250 participants who pitched more than 20 groundbreaking ideas.

Baked Eggs With Lentils, Peppers

And Tomatoes

Makes 8 servings Preparation: 20 min Cooking Time: 55 min Serving Size:

1 egg and 1 cup (250 mL) tomato and lentil sauce

INGREDIENTS

- 1 tsp cumin
- 1 tsp coriander
- 2 large onions, thinly sliced
- 2 Tbsp olive oil
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 4 bell peppers (variety), sliced into 1/2 inch (1 cm) strips
- 1 Tbsp honey
- 2 bay leaves
- 1 Tbsp chopped thyme
- 1/2 cup chopped cilantro (reserve some for garnish)
- 10 large Roma tomatoes, chopped
- 1 tsp smoked paprika
- sea salt & ground black pepper, to taste
- 1 cup cooked or canned green lentils drained and rinsed
- 8 large eggs
- 1/2 cup feta cheese, crumbled

METHOD

PREHEAT oven to 400 °F (200 °C). COOK in a large, ovenproof sauté pan over medium high heat, the cumin and coriander for 2 minutes stirring often. Add onions and olive oil, and sauté 5 minutes. Add garlic, peppers, honey, bay leaves, thyme, cilantro, and cook for 5 minutes, stirring often. Add tomatoes, paprika, and season with salt and pepper. Reduce heat to medium low and simmer for 10 minutes. STIR in cooked lentils and cook 7 minutes longer. Remove bay leaves. CONTINUE in your ovenproof sauté pan, or divide lentil sauce into 8 individual ovenproof skillets or ramekins. Make 8 indentations in the sauce and crack an egg into each. Sprinkle with crumbled feta cheese. Bake for 15 minutes or until eggs are cooked to desired doneness. GARNISH with chopped cilantro, and serve. Source: Dietitians of Canada, www.cookspiration.com


