Women who have appointments for non-stress tests and cesarean sections also attend the OB Triage Program.

Strawberry Apple Salsa With Cinnamon Crisps

Makes 5 servings

INGREDIENTS Cinnamon Crisps

5 small (8-inch/20 cm) flour tortillas

1 tbsp granulated sugar

1/2 tsp ground cinnamon

Strawberry Apple Salsa

1 cup hulled strawberries

1 medium tart apple, peeled and diced

2 tbsp liquid honey or brown sugar

1/2 tsp grated orange zest (optional)

METHOD

Cinnamon Crisps: Brush tortillas with water; sprinkle with sugar and cinnamon. Cut into wedges. Place on nonstick baking sheet and bake in preheated oven for 5 minutes or until golden and crisp. Strawberry Apple Salsa: In a medium bowl, mash strawberries; add apple, honey and, if using, orange zest. Stir to blend well. Serve with Cinnamon Crisps.

For all members of the Interdisciplinary Teams





- Notice the falling leaf on the patient room \mathbf{X} Walk by a patient room and ignore door frames.
- Complete a visual sweep of the patient & the patient environment.
- Call for help if the patient appears to be trying to get out of bed/ chair or ambulating alone or appears in an unsafe situation.
- X Fail to check when walking by a patient room.
- Observe a patient trying to get out of bed or chair or ambulating alone with out notifying nursing staff.

SUN SAFETY

CAP IT

• Check the UV index - 3 or higher requires your sunalasses and wide brimmed hat

TIMEIT

- Limit exposure time to the sun between 11am and 4pm when sun is the strongest
 - Beware of medications sensitive to UV rays

DRINK IT

- Stay hydrated
- Drink plenty of fluids throughout the day
 - Don't wait to get thirsty

SCREENIT

- Apply SPF 15 or higher to all exposed skin
 - Re-apply often and generously
 - Use 'water resistant' sunscreens

Community Working To Reduce Injury

WRH joined with other community partners to celebrate the City of Windsor's designation as a Canadian Safe Community.

The designation comes from Parachute Canada, a national organization dedicated to preventing injuries and saving lives. Led by The Safety Village, a year-long drive for the designation included identifying existing programming and opportunities to improve injury prevention and awareness to meet criteria for the designation.

WRH is represented on the Safe Communities Windsor leadership table by Diane Bradford, who among her duties is the manager of the regional trauma program and injury prevention.
