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Cancer of the cervix (cervical cancer), is the fourth most common cause of cancer-related death among women worldwide. The best way to detect cervical cancer is by having regular Papanicolaou tests, or Pap smears. (Pap is a shortened version of the name of the doctor who developed the screening test.) A Pap smear is a microscopic examination of cells taken from the uterine cervix. A Pap smear can detect viral infections such as Human Papillomavirus (HPV), which is known to cause cervical cancer. Early treatment of precancerous changes detected on the Pap smear can stop cervical cancer before it fully develops. A woman may have cervical cancer and not know it because she may not have any symptoms.

The incidence of cancer and deaths from cervical cancer has significantly declined over the years because of prevention, screening, and early detection by the Pap smear. Most abnormal Pap smear results indicate the early stages of disease and need reasonable observation by a doctor.

Over 13,324 women between the ages of 35 and 49 in Erie St. Clair (ESC) are overdue for their cervical cancer screening test (i.e. somewhere between 3 and 15 years overdue). The ESC Regional Cancer Program (RCP) knows it is always better to catch things early, and a Pap test is the only way to find abnormal cell changes that could lead to cervical cancer. 

Warm Potato, Corn & Sausage Salad

Makes 8 servings / Preparation: 15 min / Cooking Time: 20 min

INGREDIENTS

- 1-1/2 lb (750 g) small Ontario White Potatoes, scrubbed
- 1 each Ontario Sweet Red and Orange Pepper
- 2 cobs Ontario Sweet Corn, cooked
- 3 Ontario Green Onions, sliced
- 2 cups Ontario Smoked Sausage, such as kielbasa, diced
- 2 tbsp chopped fresh Ontario Parsley

DRESSING

- 1/3 cup olive oil
- 2 tbsp red wine vinegar
- 1 clove Ontario Garlic, minced
- 1/2 tsp salt - 1/4 tsp pepper

METHOD



In large saucepan, cover potatoes with cold salted water; bring to boil. Reduce heat and simmer until tender, about 15 minutes. Drain, rinse and let cool enough to handle; cut in half or quarters, depending on size of potatoes. Meanwhile, cut red and orange peppers into quarters, removing stems and seeds. Place on preheated barbecue arill over medium heat; arill until softened and slightly charred, 15 to 20 minutes. Let cool enough to handle; chop. Cut kernels from corn and place in large bowl. Add potatoes, peppers, green onions and sausage. DRESSING: In small bowl, combine oil, vinegar, garlic, salt and pepper; add to potato mixture and gently toss. Sprinkle with parsley. Serve warm.
