Stair Climbers Step Up For Neurosciences!

Superheroes no longer consist of people flying around with capes. They look like ordinary individuals who are trying to make a difference in our world. An individual such as Dr. Dante Morassutti is a perfect example of a superhero. As the former Chief of Neurosciences at Windsor Regional Hospital, he had a vision of getting healthier to set an example for his patients. One evening at dinner with friend, Richard Vennettilli, he threw out the idea of climbing Mt. Kilimanjaro, the highest mountain range in Africa. Dennis Segatto overheard their conversation and wanted in on the idea. The three men challenged themselves to get in shape with the objective to climb the famous mountain.

They developed KiliKlimb 2015 as a way to raise funds for the Neuroscience Program and also to embrace Dennis's passion, the Trillium Gift of Life's organ and tissue donor awareness.

After much planning, the trio, along with their wives and friends set off in late June of 2015 to climb Mt. Kilimanjaro. KiliKlimb 2015 was a great success. As Dr. Morassutti explained to a Windsor Star reporter, "It was the most awesome, difficult and sickening thing, all combined, that I have ever done!" The event raised approximately \$70,000 for Neurosciences toward the purchase of much needed medical equipment for patient care and recovery.

Stair Climbers Step Up For Neurosciences Cont'd

This coming January 15, 2017, Europro Vertical Climb is an event that mimics the original fundraising efforts where individuals and teams can challenge themselves to climb the 13-floor stairway in the FCA Chrysler facility at 1 Riverside Drive West. Proceeds again will support the Neuroscience Program at the Ouellette Campus, benefitting patients affected with complex traumatic brain injuries, cancer issues, stroke related illness, brain aneurysms and degenerative diseases.

Anyone can sign up, aged 12 and over and can run the vertical route multiple times. Running up the stairway and down seven times is equal to running Toronto's CN Tower. If you want to really challenge yourself and are fit enough to do so, running or walking the Europro Vertical Climb; if you accomplish 12 rounds of the Chrysler facility stairwell, it is equivalent to climbing the 163-floors of the Burj Khalifa, the tallest building in Dubai and in the world!

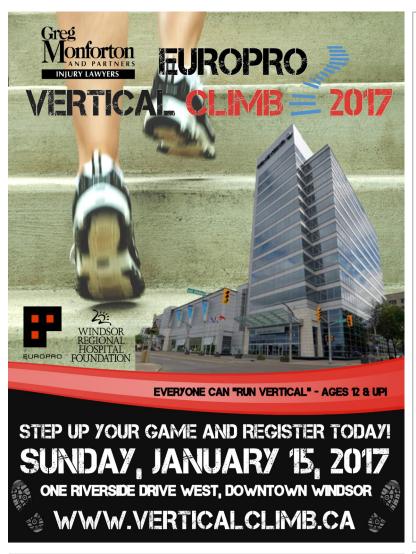

Turkey Pot Pie With Tea Biscuit Crust

Makes 4 Servings / Preparation: 20 min Cooking Time: 20-30 minutes

INGREDIENTS

- 2 medium Potatoes, peeled and cubed
- 2 medium Carrots, peeled and sliced
- 1 can (10 oz) cream of chicken, celery, mushroom soup
- 1 large Onion, chopped
- 1/4 cup chicken broth
- 2 cups cubed cooked turkey or chicken
- 1 cup quartered Ontario Mushrooms
- 1 cup frozen green peas, thawed
- 1/4 tsp dried thyme - Pinch black pepper
 - 1 1/2 cups tea biscuit mix
- 2 tbsp chopped fresh parsley
- 1/3 cup milk

METHOD

In 8 cup (2 L) round microwavable heatproof casserole, combine potatoes, carrots, onion and chicken broth. Cover and microwave at High for 10 to 12 minutes or until vegetables are almost tender, stirring twice during cooking. Stir in turkey, mushrooms, peas, soup, thyme and pepper until evenly combined, smoothing top. Set aside. In small bowl, combine biscuit mix and parsley; stir in just enough milk to make a soft, sticky dough. Turn out onto floured surface and knead 6 to 8 times. Roll or pat into circle to fit casserole. Place dough on filling (don't worry if it falls apart, just pat together). Cut a few steam slits in topping. Bake in preheated 400°F (200°C) oven until top is golden brown and filling is bubbly, 20 to 25 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes before serving. Microwave recipes tested in a 700-watt microwave oven. Power level terminology in microwave ovens varies; check your owner's manual and use whichever word or number gives you the same percentages as in the recipe (High is always 100%). If your oven differs, cooking times may vary.
