## **MORE OB Program Continues To Achieve International Recognition!**

At Windsor Regional Hospital (WRH) we strive to provide each patient with an outstanding experience throughout their journey. Following the realignment of Grace Hospital and Metropolitan Hospital in December 2003, challenges of the merging cultures became evident. In order to improve the quality and safety of our patient care, promote open communication, eliminate a culture of blame, embrace a standard of common knowledge and promote trust and respect among health care providers WRH implemented Salus Global's Managing Obstetrical Risk Efficiently (MORE OB) Program. The MORE OB program is founded on High Reliability Organization (HRO) principles such as safety, communication, team effort, rehearing emergencies, dissolving hierarchy and multidisciplinary reviews. Annually all MORE OB participants (physicians, RN staff, midwives, and clinical practice managers) complete an online exam and a culture assessment survey (CAS). From the results, the multidisciplinary core team creates the next year's goals emphasizing identified areas of weakness. "As we progress into year 12, we challenge ourselves to continue using strategies that have generated staff participation in the past, create new fresh ideas to keep the staff engaged and highlight the beneficial changes which have happened as a result of MORE OB on our unit," stated Devon Lanspeary, Clinical Practice Manager (CPM) in the Family Birthing Centre (FBC). In an effort to continue the forward movement and motivate teams to raise the bar, MORE OB offers two patient safety awards annually, the recognition award and patient safety award. "We are proud to announce that for 2016, the Family Birthing Centre is the recipient of both awards!

"This is an outstanding achievement and I am so proud of our team for all of the hard work, motivation and commitment to patient safety and implementing new ideas which have facilitated our success," stated Devon Lanspeary CPM, FBC.

The recognition award is a means of highlighting a team's success through the measurement of participation. In order to achieve the award 80% of participants must read and log a minimum of two chapters, complete 1 skills drill, 1 emergency drill, attend an annual workshop, complete an ACE (Action to Consolidate Education) and complete the CAS/post test. The program also emphasizes evidence of the utilization of audits, teamwork and communication tools, review of no harm events, regular core team meetings, a shared workload, physician engagement and senior leadership engagement to achieve the recognition award. In total FBC has been the recipient of this award for 5 consecutive years since its initiation in 2012.

## MORE OB Program Continues To Achieve cont'd...

The International Patient Safety Award is an opportunity for teams to highlight how they have demonstrated an exceptional commitment to improving patient safety within their obstetrical unit. In 2012 FBC won for their submission highlighting patient safety huddles and bedside report. In 2016 they are the recipients for their "Quiet Time - Baby Bonding at It's Best" submission. Following a presentation highlighting the long-term cognitive/neurodevelopmental benefits of ongoing skin-to-skin for the first year of life, the core team identified the success of immediate skin-to-skin contact with the mother baby unit for the first two hours after birth and they variably implemented skin-to-skin following the initial two hours. The goal was clear: every mother and baby would participate in a minimum of one hour of uninterrupted skin-to-skin daily during their hospital stay to facilitate bonding, normalize maternal and infant vital signs in the early transition period, assist in establishing breastfeeding

and decrease supplementation rates. Key strategies for success included involvement and education for the patients during the antenatal period and education for front-line staff within the FBC starting in March 2016.

Quiet time posters were placed in the OB/GYN office waiting rooms, OB triage and all patient rooms. Information about quiet time was posted on a popular local "All 4 Mamas" facebook page. Since the implementation, data has been gathered through leadership rounding on patient's emotional support and satisfaction as well as tracking supplementation rates through BORN. "As an organization that strives to be the best, both of these awards are incredible achievements which highlight the teamwork, communication and drive that is necessary to truly make a difference that results in an outstanding patient experience with no exceptions," said Devon Lanspeary CPM, FBC.



### **Baked Springtime Risotto**

Makes 8 servings Preparation: 15 min Cook Time: 40 min

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 Tbsp Olive oil
- 1 Small onion, diced
- 1 Clove garlic, minced
- 1 cup Arborio rice
- 3 cups Hot chicken broth, divided
- 1/2 tsp Salt (or to taste)
- 10 Thin spears asparagus, cut into short pieces
- 1 Red bell pepper, cut into thin strips
- 1/4 cup Freshly grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup Minced fresh parsley
- Freshly ground black pepper

#### **DIRECTIONS**

Preheat oven to 350° F (180° C). In a medium saucepan, heat oil over medium heat. Sauté onion and garlic for 5 minutes or until softened. Add rice and cook, stirring, for about 1 minute or until evenly coated. Add 2 cups (500 mL) of the broth and salt; bring to a simmer. Transfer to casserole dish, cover and place on baking sheet. Bake in preheated oven for 15 minutes. Remove from oven and stir in the remaining broth, asparagus and red pepper. Cover and bake for 15 minutes or until rice is al dente (tender to the bite) and most of the liquid is absorbed. Ladle into serving bowls and sprinkle each serving with cheese, parsley and pepper to taste.
