#WEareready...#WEwereheard...#WErMovingForward!

The Ontario Government and Ministry of Health and Long Term Care has given the green light for the Windsor-Essex Hospitals System proposal to move forward in the planning process, a key historic milestone that ensures it's now just a matter of "when", not "if" we are getting a new Windsor/Essex hospital system for our region. This is now a reality!

"What it means is that the decision makers heard loud and clear that Windsor-Essex supports this once-in-a-lifetime, desperately needed transformation of healthcare delivery for our region," said Dave Cooke, Co-Chair of the Steering Committee of regional partners overseeing planning of this project.

"In October 2013 Hôtel-Dieu Grace (HDGH) entered into a historical realignment of Hospital Services with Windsor Regional Hospital (WRH). The unprecedented agreement represented the commitment of HDGH for the support of a progressive and modernized "system-wide hospital plan" while continuing to honour the rich 128-year heritage and history of Hôtel-Dieu and the Religious Hospitallers of St. Joseph as well as the nearly 100-year legacy of the Salvation Army and Grace Hospital" stated Janice Kaffer, President and CEO of Hôtel-Dieu Grace Healthcare.

"The Provincial Government's commitment to proceed with the next steps for planning is validation of the proposal. The proposed Windsor-Essex Hospital System plan includes key investments at the Tayfour & Ouellette Campus'. The programs and services offered from both of these locations are consistent with our founding members' desire and intent to work with our community's most vulnerable, marginalized and disenfranchised citizens".

The next Stage in the planning process, also referred to as the 'Functional Program', is a very detailed description of how the new system will operate. It is the primary document used to develop the building design for the new hospital system across Windsor-Essex and will also include a detailed description of how programs and services will function and examine staffing and equipment needs. Due to the magnitude of the planning that needs to be done this process will take time however we are moving forward.

"We are still 7 to 10 years away from occupancy for components of the plan," stated David Musyj, President and CEO, WRH and Steering Committee Co-Chair. David went on to say, "However, some of the most important work is done in the upcoming stages to make sure we get it right when it comes to planning how the hospitals will operate and what is required to make them not only supportive of today's patient population, but, for generations to come."

Again, a heartfelt thanks is extended to the Corporation of the County of Essex and the Corporation of the City of Windsor for their foresight in approving a \$200 million levy, the ten percent community share.

Now, it begins! The Steering Committee encourages the community to stay informed and to participate wholly in the next phases. If anyone is interested in taking an active role in the planning, they may go to www.windsorhospitals.ca and register their name and address.

Bell Building Regional Renal Program Stunning!

A 'sneak preview' and media event took place last Wednesday when the newly constructed Windsor Regional Hospital – Regional Renal Program offered patients, families, staff, volunteers and the general public to stop by and see the new facility at 1147 Goveau Street.

The open house gave staff an opportunity to show off the new site with updated renal dialysis stations to facilitate patient care in a well lit, expanded and comfortable setting. Construction was managed by DeAngelis Construction. Lynne Watts, Board Chair of Windsor Regional Hospital thanked the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care and the Erie St. Clair LHIN. Total funding was approximately \$12 million with a \$1.8 million share provided by the Windsor-Essex region.

The new facility will house 30 new dialysis stations, with 10 still available in the Jeanne Mance Building for higher acuity patients, 4 stations remaining on the 7th Floor at Ouellette and 7 satellite stations at Learnington District Memorial Hospital. The McDougall satellite station closes due to the new facility officially opening with patients on May 8th, 2017.

"This new unit is a wonderful, bright, fresh and comfortable setting that will benefit patients and families for many years to come," stated Monica Staley Liang, Vice President for the renal program.

During the media event, Dr. Amit Bagga said, "There is a growing need for treatment of kidney disorders in our region, actually at a rate higher than the provincial average. We need to ensure we have the best facilities and quality care surroundings for out patients as well as the hard working staff and volunteers."

One of the quests invited to speak was Psychologist, Dr. Martin Girash, Board Chair of the Erie St. Clair LHIN who emphasized the importance of programs such as kidney dialysis to the region and having it available in facilities that enhance the entire care-experience for the patient.

The media event also welcomed two patients, Darbara Hebert and Patricia Baiusz, members of the Renal Patient and Family Advisory Committee who spoke about the positive aspects of the new facility and how important the staff are to the program.

Richard Vennettilli, President of the Windsor Regional Hospital Foundation thanked the many donors from Windsor-Essex who have faithfully given toward the renal project over the years, reminding everyone that there continues to be a need for philanthropy and donating to this and other Windsor Regional Hospital causes.

Strawberry Banana Oatmeal

Makes 8 servings Preparation: 15 min Cook Time: 35-40 min

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup mashed ripe banana (3 medium)
- 2 eaas
- 3 cups milk (whichever type you prefer)
- 1/4 cup pure maple syrup
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 4 cups old-fashioned oats
- 1 ½ cups chopped strawberries, plus more for serving



Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Lightly grease a 9x13-inch baking dish. In a large bowl, whisk together mashed banana, eggs, milk, maple syrup, vanilla, cinnamon, baking powder and salt. Stir in the oats and then the strawberries until combined. Carefully pour the mixture into the prepared baking dish. Bake for 35-40 minutes, until oatmeal is set. (A toothpick inserted into the center should come out mostly clean, rather than wet.) Let stand for 5 minutes before serving. Serve oatmeal topped with additional strawberries.
