

Cabbage Apple Slaw

Makes 6-8 servings Preparation: 0 min Cook Time: 10 min

INGREDIENTS

- 4 cups (1 L) thinly sliced cabbage
- 1 carrot, shredded
- 1/3 cup (75 mL) dried cranberries
- 3 tbsp (45 mL) cider vinegar
- 2 tsp (10 mL) canola oil
- 1/2 tsp (2 mL) each granulated sugar and celery seed
- 1/2 tsp (2 mL) hot pepper sauce
- 1/4 tsp (1 mL) fresh ground pepper
- 3 tbsp (45 mL) chopped walnuts or pecans
- 1 large apple
- 2 tbsp (25 mL) chopped fresh mint

DIRECTIONS

In a large bowl, toss together cabbage, carrot and cranberries; set aside. In a small bowl, whisk together vinegar, oil, sugar, celery seed, hot pepper sauce and pepper. Drizzle over cabbage mixture and add walnuts. Grate apple and add to salad. Sprinkle with mint and toss well to coat.
