RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Corn and Zucchini Medley

Makes 5 servings Preparation: 5 min Cooking Time: 25 min



INGREDIENTS

- 4 slices bacon
- 1 1/2 cups fresh corn kernels
- 1/4 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese
- 2 cups chopped zucchini
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 pinch pepper

DIRECTIONS

Place bacon in a large, deep skillet. Cook over medium-high heat until evenly brown. Reserve 1 tablespoon of drippings. Drain bacon, chop, and set aside. Heat the bacon drippings in the skillet over medium heat. Sauté the zucchini, corn, and onion until tender but still crisp, about 10 minutes. Season with pepper. Spoon vegetables into a bowl, and sprinkle with chopped bacon and shredded cheese.

Fracture Clinic Enhanced by Prevention Coordinator

Windsor Regional Hospital announced officially last week that it has partnered with Osteoporosis Canada, introducing a new Fracture Prevention Coordinator, Sam Ladeia who will assist in coordinating patient flow for those with new and concurrent fractures.

Osteoporosis is a disease characterized by the low bone mass and deterioration of bone tissue, It is often known as the 'silent thief' because bone loss can occur without symptoms. It can result in broken bones, loss of mobility and decreased independence for an individual at any age.

Supported by the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care, the Fracture Prevention Coordinator will work alongside Fracture Clinic staff to assist with early identification, education and treatment of patients who attend the clinic and, who are at moderate to high-risk for future fractures.

Some key factors to note:

- Fractures due to osteoporosis are more common than heart attacks, strokes and breast cancer.
- At lease 1 in 3 women and 1 in 5 men will suffer from an Osteoporotic fracture during their lifetime.
- Osteoporosis causes 70% to 90% of 30,000 hip fractures annually in Canada.
- 28% of women and, 37% of men who suffer a hip fracture will die within the following year.
- 80% of patients who present with a fracture are not assessed for possible underlying osteoporosis and prescribed medication. The result is hundreds of thousands of Canadians needlessly suffering a fracture each year because their Osteoporosis goes undiagnosed and untreated.
- 14% of individuals with a wrist fracture will suffer a repeat fracture within 3 years.
