Strawberry Bread

Preparation: 30 min Cook Time: 45 min

INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups fresh strawberries
- 3 1/8 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 cups white sugar
- 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 1/4 cups vegetable oil
- 4 eggs, beaten
- -11/4 cups chopped pecans

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Butter and flour two 9 x 5-inch loaf pans. Slice strawberries and place in mediumsized bowl. Sprinkle lightly with sugar, and set aside while preparing batter. Combine flour, sugar, cinnamon, salt and baking soda in large bowl; mix well. Blend oil and eggs into strawberries. Add strawberry mixture to flour mixture, blending until dry inaredients are just moistened. Stir in pecans. Divide Bake in preheated oven until a tester batter into pans. inserted in the center comes out clean, 45 to 50 minutes (test each loaf separately). Let cool in pans on wire rack for 10 minutes. Turn loaves out of pans, and allow to cool before slicing.

There are now 9 states in Brazil with confirmed yellow fever cases, continuing an outbreak that began in January 2017. 1,311 cases of yellow fever (519 suspected and 792 confirmed) have been reported, with a case-fatality rate of 34.6% among confirmed cases.

Six Months Left Before WRH Grounds Are 100% Smoke-Free

Canada Day is almost here - the year will be half way over and there will only be another half year before a complete smoking ban will be in place on any area of hospital property.

As of January 1, 2018, WRH and all other hospitals in Ontario must be completely smoke free on hospital grounds, in compliance with legislation passed by the Ontario Government and the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care under the Smoke Free Ontario Act. This means there will be no designated smoking areas permitted at either campus.

Currently, and on until January 1, 2018, at Ouellette Campus, you must use the smoking shelter on Goyeau Street next to the Bell Building and at the Met Campus, you must use the smoking shelter at the corner of Lens and Kildare Road.

Violators are subject to a FINE of \$305.00 for a FIRST OFFENSE, which is enforced by the Windsor Essex Health Unit's Tobacco Enforcement Unit. On Windsor Regional Hospital property, the Security Department can and will be the first line of enforcement for both staff and patrons, but the reports generated and sent to the Tobacco Enforcement Officers will be reasonable grounds to lay charges.

Security and other staff have noticed some individuals smoking in areas outside of the designated spots. Please refrain from smoking in any other area of our properties out of courtesy to our guests and your colleagues.
