FBC Captures International Patient Safety Award

A team from Windsor Regional Hospital's Family Birthing Centre (FBC) were in Ottawa recently to accept the International Patient Safety Award for their innovative, "Quiet Time - Baby Bonding at its Best!" submission.

The Award was an opportunity for the Family Birthing Centre teams to highlight how they have demonstrated an exceptional commitment to improving patient safety within their obstetrical unit. It was a presentation highlighting the long term cognitive/neurodevelopmental benefits of ongoing skin-to-skin bonding for the contact with the mother baby unit for the first two hours after birth. Mother and baby would participate in a minimum of one hour of uninterrupted skin-to-skin daily bonding during their hospital stay. The effect was to facilitate bonding, normalize maternal and infant vital signs in the early transition period, assist in establishing breastfeeding and decrease supplementation rates. Key strategies for success included involvement and education for the patients during the antenatal period and, education for front line staff within the FBC which began in 2016.

The Award was merited on tasks developed such as Quiet Time posters placed throughout the OB/GYN offices waiting rooms, OB Triage and all patient rooms. Information about Quiet Time was posted on a popular local "All 4 Mamas" Facebook page.

"On behalf of Windsor Regional Hospital and all of us in the Family Birthing Centre, I congratulate everyone who parlicipated and made the International Patient Safety Award a reality," said Deborah Mayea-Parent, Director, Women's and Children's Services for WRH.

VRE bacteremia rates in Ontario have nearly doubled in the most recent two quarters compared to any given quarter over the past two years, and the increase appears to be occurring predominantly in hospitals where VRE screening and isolation practices have been discontinued. Public Health Ontario currently recommends that hospitals currently screening and isolating for VRE continue these practices. Further, hospitals that discontinued screening and isolating for VRE should consider reinstating this practice.

WRH and Caesars Windsor Go Light And Bright For Injury Prevention!

Windsor Regional Hospital and Caesars Windsor collaborated this month to highlight the importance of injury prevention!

Caesars Windsor was lit up in "green" on the evening of July 5th to recognize National Injury Prevention Day, joining other major Canadian landmarks such as Toronto's CN Tower, and communities across the country such as Calgary, Vancouver, London and Edmonton in raising awareness of "preventable injury."

Preventable injury, which includes motor vehicle collisions, sports and recreation injuries and seniors' falls, accounts for 16,000 deaths every year in Canada.

WRH is proud to participate in this countrywide program coordinated by Parachute Canada, a national organization dedicated to raising awareness about how to prevent serious injuries. Noting that one child in Canada dies every nine hours due to a preventable injury – which kills more Canadian children than any single disease, and more youth than all other causes combined. Parachute has launched its #StopTheClock hashtag to spread the word on social media.

Coinciding with the Parachute campaign, WRH has also launched the first in a series of locally produced videos intended to help promote injury prevention awareness right here in Windsor-Essex. Sponsored by the WRH Regional Trauma Program and produced by WE-TV, the first short video features local emergency officials in a mock exercise responding to a motor vehicle collision. The videos will be played on our hospital screens and we're encouraging them to be shared in social media posts throughout our community. The first video can be found on our


New Paramedics Introduced At EMS Event

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

California Grilled **Veggie Sandwich**



Makes 4 servings

Preparation: 30 min / Cook Time: 20 min

INGREDIENTS

- 1/4 cup mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 cup sliced red bell peppers
- 1 red onion, sliced
- 3 cloves garlic, minced - 1/8 cup olive oil
- 1 small zucchini, sliced
- 1 small yellow squash, sliced
- 2 (4-x6-inch) focaccia bread pieces, split horizontally
- 1/2 cup crumbled feta cheese

DIRECTIONS

In a bowl, mix the mayonnaise, minced garlic, and lemon juice. Set aside in the refrigerator. Preheat the grill for high heat. Brush vegetables with olive oil on each side. Brush grate with oil. Place bell peppers and zucchini closest to the middle of the grill, and set onion and squash pieces around them. Cook for about 3 minutes, turn, and cook for another 3 minutes. The peppers may take a bit longer. Remove from grill, and set aside. Spread some of the mayonnaise mixture on the cut sides of the bread, and sprinkle each one with feta cheese. Place on the grill cheese side up, and cover with lid for 2 to 3 minutes. This will warm the bread, and slightly melt the cheese. Watch carefully so the bottoms don't burn. Remove from grill, and layer with the vegetables. Enjoy as open faced grilled sandwiches.
