Windsor's own Poet Laureate, Marty Gervais, is returning to Windsor Regional Hospital on Tuesday, October 3 for one exciting new reading and signing as part of BookFest and the City of Windsor's Literary Arts Windsor 2017 Fall Event Series. Tradition dates back to the Italy Classical Age in the 1300's where a poet laureate is a poet officially appointed by a government or conferring institution, who is often expected to compose poems for special events and occasions.

BookFest is an annual event which, since 2002 promotes literary arts in partnership with local organizations including the University of Windsor, Windsor Public Library, Art Gallery of Windsor, local elementary and secondary schools, local art and music venues, restaurants, and Windsor Regional Hospital. Readings are held at various locations in support of BookFest.

This year, we are happy to welcome back local author, Marty Gervais who will offer a reading from his new book "Five Towns: Touring Windsor's Past." The book takes readers on a narrative walking tour of Ford City, Riverside, Walkerville, Windsor, and Sandwich. Along the way, tales of indigenous curses, rum-running, riots, union-busting, horse-racing nuns, lethal lightning strikes, and murderous ministers abound!

How I Quit: Stories From Colleagues

Are you an ex-smoker or know of one who has tips to help your colleagues kick the habit?

There's still time to send us a note in 100-200 words on how you or someone you know quit smoking in time for a draw for a \$100 gift card before Thanksgiving weekend!

As noted in previous newsletters, due to provincial legislation that comes into effect on January 1, 2018, there will be no smoking allowed of cigarettes, e-cigarettes, medical marijuana any other tobacco product on hospital property. This means, by law, we also must close the remaining Designated Smoking Areas on hospital arounds by New Year's Day.

We know quitting smoking is difficult. If you've been able to quit, or know someone who did like a friend or family member, tell us how it was done! Telling people how you or someone you know was able to kick the habit can encourage and inform those who are struggling to quit themselves, including our colleagues! You can also tell us how quitting smoking has improved your life!

We have uploaded some great notes from former smokers. Here are a couple of examples:

"After numerous years and numerous attempts to quit smoking, I finally did 13 years ago. Other methods were tried in the past including acupuncture, medication, etc. It was not planned at this time and nowhere near New Year's; however, I did use Nicorette Inhaler and regular gum, and the greatest trick of all was changing my habits as well as delaying my urge by doing something else, such as drinking water or chewing on ice cubes. I still get the occasional craving; however, I know what would happen and use the delay tactics again and again."

"I never really tried to guit. Then my husband had a heart attack and he guit immediately. A year later the price of cigarettes went up, I was fed up so I just said I'm DONE! When I was having a really bad craving I would go to my friends house who smoked and just breathed in the air. It helped in the beginning. I am still smoke free after four years. I have more money, and I don't stink!"

Starlight and Toys R US Collaborate To Fund Windsor Regional Hospital

For over 23 years, Starlight Children's Foundation has been transforming the lives of Canadian children who live with serious illness. What makes Starlight unique is that they are there for the entire journey, from the emergency room to recovery.

Their mission is to partner with experts to improve the life and health of kids and families around the world.

Starlight Children's Foundation partners with Toys R Us to raise funds. Toys R Us, internationally, has raised \$1.75 million during their last campaign. In partnership, a grant program was established as one of the many programs which Toys R Us offers support. This is the ninth year for the grant program where, over \$900,000 has been distributed to hospitals across Canada.

Recently, Starlight Children's Foundation Canada representative, Krystine Ross visited the local Toys R Us store on Howard Avenue and presented Holly Whitehead, representing Paediatric Child Life Services with a grant of \$2000. The funds will support the revamping of Child Life's special needs resources to better serve this patient population while they are in hospital. It will assist special needs children affected by distraction, relaxation and stimulation.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Maple-Roasted Sweet Potatoes

Makes 6-8 servings: 1 Serving is 1/2 cup

Preparation: 10 min Cook Time: 70 min

INGREDIENTS

- 8 cups of sweet potatoes, peeled and cut into 1½-inch pieces
- 1/3 cup pure maple syrup
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- ½ teaspoon salt
- Freshly ground pepper, to taste



DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 400°F. Arrange sweet potatoes in an even layer in a 9-by-13-inch glass baking dish. Combine maple syrup, butter, lemon juice, salt and pepper in small bowl. Pour the mixture over the sweet potatoes; toss to coat. Cover and bake the sweet potatoes for 15 minutes. Uncover, stir and cook, stirring every 15 minutes, until tender and starting to brown, 45 to 50 minutes more.
