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WRH And Partners Make Capital Funding Pitch

Windsor Regional Hospital and other local partners made a pitch for the new hospital system investment by the Ontario government at a pre-budget consultation hearing held in Windsor this month.

With stage 1A and stage 1B of a five-stage process complete, David Musyj, WRH CEO asked Yvan Baker, Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of Finance, for the government's support for funding to move forward in the capital planning process.

"We are ready to move to stages 2 and 3 of this project and are asking for your commitment to modern health care infrastructure in Windsor-Essex," he said in his address. "Our request is for the \$30-plus million pledged by former Minister (Dwight) Duncan upon completion of stages 1A and 1B. This will allow us to get to work on this hospital system revitalization for our community."

In 2012, former Minister Duncan helped commit a small amount of funding for Stage 1A and 1B planning but upon completion and approval by the government, an additional \$30 million in funds would carry the planning process through stages 2 and 3. These stages include work on programs, staffing, equipment and space requirements as well as design concepts.

The request for funding was echoed by our partners at Hôtel-Dieu Grace Healthcare, with CEO Janice Kaffer expressing her support for the project, as well as by Windsor Mayor Drew Dilkens and Essex County Warden Tom Bain. Both the city and county last year approved a levy to raise the required 10% local share (\$2,000,000 million) of capital costs.

At the conclusion of the hearings, Baker said he had heard "loud and clear" that the hospital is a top local priority and would pass this along to Finance Minister Charles Sousa and Health Minister Eric Hoskins.

"I've been to Windsor three times over the past year and each time I've come I've heard about how important the hospital is to the community here and how important it is to the community that the project moves forward," he told the Windsor Star.

Clinic Seeker Offers Alternative To Emergency Department At Windsor Regional Hospital

It's flu season and along with all those nasty illnesses comes congestion in our Emergency Departments which can be frustrating for patients waiting to be seen.

With ED volumes in mind, Windsor Regional Hospital (WRH) is pleased to support a new mobile app developed by two local entrepreneurs that gives patients directions and information on local ED alternatives for patients with less serious concerns.

Clinic Seeker was developed by Lisa Jacobs and Brett Bildfell, both of whom have experience in the local health care sector. The two came up with a concept to build a website and mobile app which helps users locate nearby clinics. The hours of operation of those clinics will be listed, and eventually, as users populate the app and the site, wait time estimates will also be listed.

Lisa and Brett approached WRH about the idea several months ago. The mobile app officially launched this month, and can now be downloaded for free on Google Play and the App Store.

"Clinic Seeker directs you to the closest health care facility with the shortest wait times," Jacobs said. "Clinic Seeker instantly provides basic information such as directions, contact information, hours of operation as well as whether it has labs and x-rays. In addition, patients waiting at clinics can share information on wait times, letting others know which clinics are running smoothly and which backlogged clinics to avoid."

In support of the concept, WRH has posted a link to Clinic Seeker on our website to make it easier for patients to access it. Staff can also direct patients who ask about ED alternatives to the Clinic Seeker website or app, whereas previously our website had published locations and numbers for clinics that sometimes fell out of date.

Almond Coconut Granola

Makes 7 cups, 1/4 cup/servings Preparation: 10 min Cooking Time: 60 min

INGREDIENTS

- 3 cups Large flake oats
- 1 cup Slivered almonds
- 3/4 cup Shredded coconut
- 1/2 cup Ground flax seed
- 1/4 cup Dark brown sugar
- 3 Tbsp Pure maple syrup
- 3 Tbsp Canola oil
- 1/2 cup Dried diced apricots
- 1/2 cup Dried cranberries



DIRECTIONS

In a large bowl, combine oats, almonds, coconut, flax seed, sugar, maple syrup and oil. Stir together until everything is well coated. Let stand for 15 minutes. Spread mixture onto rimmed baking sheet and bake in preheated 250°F (121°C) oven for about 1 hour, stirring every 15 minutes until golden. Remove from oven and let cool slightly. Stir in apricots and cranberries.
