The labour group held a fundraising event in 2016 where 3,000 cupcakes were sold through an initiative called, 'Cupcakes for Cupsake'!



The Windsor Regional Hospital Breast Health Centre provides expedited breast assessment service to the community. The program is affiliated with Cancer Care Ontario and meets stringent quality standards and is continually evaluated against national and provincial performance measurements. Residents of Windsor and Essex County are not only assured of timely biopsy and diagnosis of breast cancer but, if a suspicious finding is identified, rapid access to surgical consultation, surgery and, chemotherapy and/or radiation treatment is paramount.

Chickpea & Vegetable

Makes 4 servings, 2 cups each serving Preparation: 10 min Cooking Time: 20 min



INGREDIENTS

- 10 Mini potatoes, cooked and cooled
- 2 cups Romaine lettuce, chopped
- Half English cucumber, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup Cabbage, finely shredded
- 1/2 cup Canned drained and rinsed chickpeas
- 2 tbsp Red Delicious apple, cored and thinly sliced
- 2 tbsp Light Ranch style or mayonnaise dressing

DIRECTIONS

Cut potatoes into quarters and place in large bowl. Add lettuce, cucumber, cabbage, chickpeas and apple. In a small bowl, whisk together dressing and yogurt. Drizzle over top of salad and toss to coat evenly.
