WRH is proud to support organ and tissue donation awareness! Every April, our hospital supports the province-wide efforts of Trillium Gift of Life Network to raise awareness of this life-saving issue and promote the importance of registering your consent to donate online. Clinically, we have also been recognized by Trillium for our the dedication and engagement of all Critical Care, Emergency and Operating Room teams, Trillium Gift of Life coordinators, and the generosity of donor families, in working together to save the lives of people who are waiting for a second chance through organ donation.

This year there are lots of ways in which our entire team at WRH can participate and work together to raise awareness in our community!

On Monday, April 8th, we will join thousands of Canadians on "Green Shirt Day" by wearing green in memory of former Humboldt Bronco hockey player, Logan Boulet, and celebrating the Gift of Life he gave through organ donation. This coincides with the one-year anniversary of the Humboldt bus tragedy.

We at WRH will take this celebration a step further on Friday, April 12th by further recognizing Logan and his teammates with Jersey Day. This was a big hit last year with staff who wanted to do something to show support for the Humboldt Broncos and we encourage staff to wear their favourite uniform (of any support) in an extra and fun effort to raise awareness about organ and tissue donation. Fight Like Mason Foundation Goes The Extra Mile

The Fight Like Mason Foundation once again has reached out to Paediatric Services at the Met Campus with another amazing item, customized wheelchairs for young patients.

The non-for-profit registered charity, established by Iain Macri and Chantelle Bacon-Macri to recognized their son's legacy. Mason Bacon-Macri was only four years old when he lost his life as a result of cancer. His legacy is well known during his fight with the disease. He was a super-hero, being diagnosed in 2015 with Rhabdomyosarcoma, an uncommon and challenging form of childhood cancer.

In 2018, the Foundation donated 39 inspiring IV poles with favorite superhero images, deemed Mason's Power Poles. Now, the Fight Like Mason Foundation has donated 5 new customized wheelchairs.

Brain Injury CANNABIS, ADDICTION, AND MENTAL Association of Windsor & Essex County HEALTH AFTER BRAIN INJURY



Treatment Trends, Need to Knows, Research and Clinical Best Practice. for the Health Care Provider.

After brain injury, survivors will seek solutions to help resolve the lingering cognitive and emotional changes they experience. One of the solutions sought may be cannabis. With recent legalization of cannabis there is now easier access and less stigmatization of the product, and a renewed hope for recovery - but is this hope misplaced?



As most clinicians know: not all cannabis is created equal – some has positive impact, others negative. With increased access and common use of non-medical strains to self-medicate, it is timely for clinicians to become educated and understand their role in the process and the impact the product can have in the recovery of the brain injury survivor.

Keynote Address: ABC's of Medical Cannabis. Dr. Mark Kimmons, Medical Director - Sunniva (Calgary, Alberta).

Learn the current research that supports medical cannabis, how this differs from recreational cannabis, the role of cannabis after a brain injury (i.e. stroke, surgery, TBI, etc.) and role/expectation of the health care provider in the process.


Mental health and cognition after brain injury - Dr. Christopher Abeare, Neuropsychologist, University of Windsor.


#RECIPEOFTHEWEEK

Bruschetta Fish

Makes 4 servings. Preparation: 10-15 min Cooking Time: 20 min

INGREDIENTS

- 2 Tbsp canola oil
- 4 firm white fish fillets (4 oz)
- 2 cups chopped tomatoes
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 Tbsp canola oil
- 1/4 tsp pepper





- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 1/2 cup crumbled feta
- 1/2 cup minced red onion
- 1 tbsp balsamic vinegar
- 1/4 tsp salt

DIRECTIONS Preheat oven to 400°F (200°C). Pour 1 Tbsp (15 mL) canola oil in the bottom of a 9 x 13 inch (23 x 33 cm) baking dish and place fish fillets on top. Drizzle with remaining 1 Tbsp (15 mL) of canola oil and sprinkle with 1/4 tsp (1 mL) pepper. In a medium bowl, combine tomatoes, feta, red onion, garlic, balsamic vinegar, canola oil, salt and pepper. Mix to evenly combine. Top fillets evenly with tomato mixture and bake in the oven for 20 minutes, until fish is cooked through and flakes easily with a fork. Sprinkle basil evenly over top before serving.
