Local Author, Historian Celebrates Black History Month

Windsor Regional Hospital was proud to host a visit by a renowned author and historian in recognition of Black History Month.

Irene Moore Davis provided an extensive overview of Black history in Windsor and Essex County with a vibrant presentation that truly made history come alive for attendees.

Irene is the Manager, Continuing Education for St. Clair College, where she also teaches Underground Railroad history. She has been the President of the Essex County Black Historical Research Society since 2010. She also fulfills board and committee roles with the Buxton National Historic Site, the Northstar Cultural Community Centre, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, and BookFest-Windsor. Her forthcoming book is entitled Our Own Two Hands: A History of Black Lives in Windsor from the 1700s Forward.

Irene's chapter on Canadian Black settlements is included in the 2015 book A Fluid Frontier: Slavery, Resistance, And The Underground Railroad In The Detroit River Borderland (Wayne State University Press.) Her passionate contributions to the research and teaching of Black history in Windsor and Essex County earned her a 2015 University of Windsor History Department Community Heritage Medal, the 2016 John R. Park Homestead Award from the Essex Region Conservation Authority, and the 2019 E.J. Lajeunesse Award from the Essex County Historical Society.

Irene was raised in Windsor, and is proud that her family has been here since the mid-19th century. She is a graduate of the University of Windsor, Queen's University and the University of Western Ontario.

Chocolate Fudge Energy Bites

Prep Time: 15 minutes Cook Time: 0 minutes Total Time: 15 minutes Makes 16 energy bites

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup pitted dates
- 1/2 cup raw almonds
- ½ cup raw walnuts
- 1/4 cup cocoa powder
- 1-2 thisp of water (as needed)



DIRECTIONS

Add the dates to a food processor. Pulse a few times until the dates are chopped. Add the almonds and dates and pulse a few times until they are chopped and start to blend with the dates. Add the cocoa powder and 1 tbsp of water until all the ingredients start to form a batter and stick together. (You don't want to completely blend the almonds – there should be some small pieces for texture). If the mixture is still crumbly after a few minutes, add another tbsp of water (add 1 tsp at a time) so that it blends better and forms a dough like consistency. Roll into balls about ~1 inch in size. Store in the fridge for up to 7 days or keep in the freezer for up to 2 months.
