Stroke Team On The Road To Distinction

The stroke team at WRH held a kickoff event this week to mark the beginning of a journey toward Stoke Distinction.

The Stroke Distinction is awarded by Accreditation Canada. The work involved will build upon recent process improvements to improve stroke care and outcomes for patients.

Karen Riddell, VP Critical Care, Cardiology, Stroke, Trauma and Clinical Support Services, says this is part of the team's ongoing "journey toward excellence in stroke care."

Accreditation Canada surveyors will be on site in November 2020 to formally evaluate the stroke program in 5 key areas:

- The achievement of stroke performance indicator thresholds;
- The implementation of stroke protocols or clinical practice auidelines;
- Commitment to excellence and innovation;
- Commitment to client and family education; and
- The degree of compliance with Acute, Rehab, Education and System Standards.

Richard Beaton, who suffered a stroke on Remembrance Day last year was at the event to share his story and inspire the team as they begin this journey.

Beaton said the team's quick action saved his life and fought back tears as he thanked members of his care team. "I have some impairment on my left side, but I returned to work one month after and I'm grateful."


Oatmeal Protein Pancakes
