Windsor Regional Hospital Get's Its "Sneak Peek"

Front-line healthcare workers from Windsor Regional Hospital got a glimpse of what their new Hospital Information System (HIS) will look like Tuesday, June 18 and Wednesday, June 19 during sessions held at both sites.

The events, billed by the e-VOLVE program as "Cerner Sneak Peeks," helped attendees understand how an optimized provincial HIS is going to transform the delivery of safe, quality care and patient experiences in the region.

"This is actually a demonstration of the Grand River build, so it's very similar to what we will be implementing here in Erie St. Clair," said TransForm's Vice President and Chief Transformation Officer Lyn Baluyot, who is heading up the e-VOLVE program.

"Our Cerner colleagues are going to lead us through a patient's journey from the Emergency Department to inpatient, right through to discharge so that you can see how different roles interact with that patient at different points in their journey."

The demonstrations took place on Tuesday morning and afternoon at Ouellette, and on Wednesday morning and afternoon, at Met. In-between sessions, Cerner consultants remained on hand to answer questions and take the curious on a deeper dive into the Millennium system.

Windsor Regional Hospital, Hôtel-Dieu Grace Healthcare, Erie Shores HealthCare and Chatham-Kent Health Alliance have all agreed to use the HIS foundation laid by Grand River Hospital as a starting point for their build and will be determining what Erie St. Clair's clinical transformation looks like in the months ahead.

The e-VOLVE program will be helping all of the region's hospitals prepare for the changes ahead. Windsor Regional Hospital goes live with its new HIS on September 1, 2020.

Retiree Support For The Windsor-Essex Hospitals System

Four years ago, on July 16, 2015, the Program and Services Committee was joined by community leaders and healthcare professionals as the plan for a new Windsor-Essex Hospitals System was unveiled.

The transformational plan for local healthcare includes a new acute care hospital at County Rd. 42 and the 9th Concession, Urgent Care and other services in the City's core, and a Centre of Mental Health Excellence at the HDGH Tayfour Campus.

Since the project was announced, the County of Essex and City of Windsor have committed to covering the \$200 million local share of the project and are already collecting the money.

In addition, the City of Windsor voted to rezone the land for the new site. That decision is currently being appealed by a group opposed to the chosen site for the new hospital, a move that could significantly delay the process; however, community support for the project is strong and unwavering.

The Mayors of Windsor and Essex County are trying to arrange a meeting with Premier Doug Ford to let him know that despite the very vocal opposition, the silent majority is united in its support of this much needed investment in local healthcare.

At the recent WRH Retirees BBQ, former healthcare workers wanted to show their commitment to the project. Local photographer Spike Bell captured their images while they shared reasons why they feel it is time to move forward with the project.



#RECIPEOFTHEWEEK

Mascarpone Fruit Tarts

Makes 8 servings.
Total Time: 35 minutes

INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups granola
- 1/4 cup canola oil
- 3/4 cups mascarpone cheese
- 2 tablespoons maple syrup
- 1 teaspoon lime juice
- 1/3 cup liquid honey
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/4 cup whipping cream
- 1 tablespoon lime zest
- 2 cups chopped fresh fruit

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 350°F. Mist 8 cups of 12-cup muffin tin with cooking spray or line with paper liners. Set aside. In food processor, pulse granola, to a fine powder. Transfer to medium mixing bowl. Add honey, oil and vanilla; sir to combine. Divide mixture among prepared muffin cups. Use back of spoon to press mixture evenly along bottom and up sides of each cup. Bake until golden, about 15 minutes. Remove from oven and press crusts down to reshape. Let cool completely; remove crusts from tin. Meanwhile, using hand mixer on medium speed, beat mascarpone in bowl until smooth. Add cream, maple syrup, lime zest and juice; beat until combined and creamy. Fill each tart crust with mascarpone mixture. Top with fresh fruit.
