Think Tanks Help Build Bridges in the Research Community

Some of the brightest minds in the research community and beyond met up last week to share and develop research ideas at the WE-SPARK Health Institute's Think Tank event.

WE-SPARK is a collaboration between the University of Windsor, St. Clair College, Windsor Regional Hospital and Hôtel-Dieu Grace Healthcare. The goal is to create a thriving and engaged research community.



The Think Tank events help to elevate research success by bringing diverse perspectives to the table to brainstorm and develop project ideas.

On Friday, participants heard three presentations before breaking off into small discussion groups to brainstorm and develop each of the following project ideas:

- Working Together to Improve Health Literacy,
- Using Virtual Clinical Trials to Generate Evidence of Benefits & Harm of Cannabinoid Use, and
- Bridging the Gap Between Clinicians and Scientists.

This is the group's 15th Think Tank event. Friday's turnout was the best yet with more than 50 participants from 10 different organizations and 19 different disciplines including everything from physicians and scientists to teachers and professionally trained actors.

What You Should Know: Novel Coronavirus

Windsor Regional Hospital continues to monitor developments regarding the Novel Coronavirus outbreak, including staying up to date on the latest guidelines and information from Health Canada, the Ontario Ministry of Health and our local Public Health unit. We remain vigilant in protecting our staff, patients and visitors through rigorous infection and prevention controls, including screening of patients upon arrival for symptoms consistent with the Coronavirus.

If you have questions about your own health and the Coronavirus, call Telehealth: 1-866-797-0000 (24 hours, seven days a week). The following outlines the steps that WRH takes regularly to identify and manage patients with infectious symptoms:

In addition to Routine Practices, individuals who present with the acute respiratory infection symptoms and **travel history to Wuhan**, **China or have been in contact with a sick person who has travelled to Wuhan**, **China or a confirmed 2019-nCoV case**, are to be placed on **Airborne/Droplet/Contact Precautions** in an Airborne Infection Isolation Room (or a private room if an AIIR is not available). Staff are to wear gloves, gowns, N95 respirators and face protection. If a patient is identified that meets this criteria, notify the hospital IPAC department.

Heart Shaped Pizza Is Back In February

Antonino's Original Pizza is back to support the Angioplasty/ Catheterization Lab at the Ouellette Campus with the sale of heart-shaped pizzas and Nutella pizzas during the month of February.

"This has been a tradition that began as far back as 2001 and my family and pizza outlets look forward again to fundraise for the Cath Lab at Windsor Regional Hospital," stated Joe Ciaravino, owner of Antonio's Original Pizza.

Joe's father, Antonino 'Tony' Ciaravino, was one of Windsor's pizza pioneers. After emigrating from Sicily in the early 1950's, he opened the first pizzeria on Dougall Avenue in South Windsor. "My dad did not invent Windsor-style pizza but he took the existing recipe and improved upon it, and, that is the recipe we use today," said his son, Joe. That first store opened in 1959, then in 1999, Joe himself opened his first store on Howard and Talbot Road, naming it after his father. Over the years, Antonino's expanded to Tecumseh and LaSalle.

Joe added, "If you want a truly authentic Windsor-style pizza, made the traditional way, you've got to go to Antonino's Original Pizza!"

Buffalo Cauliflower Bites and Ranch Dip

Makes 4 servings Total Time: 45 min

INGREDIENTS

Bites

- 1 large head of cauliflower
- 1-2 tablespoons of olive oil
- ½ cup of breadcrumbs
- ½ cup hot sauce

Dip

- ¹/₂ cup greek yogurt
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1/2 teaspoon of onion powder
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 tablepoon dried parsley

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 450 degrees F. In a large bowl, coat the cauliflower with olive oil, pour the breadcrumbs over and toss to coat. Spread cauliflower onto a baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Roast for 20 minutes until the cauliflower begins to get tender. Remove from oven and place back into the bowl. Pour hotsauce over the cauliflower and toss to coat. Spread back over the baking pan and bake for another 10-15 minutes. Toss with a few more breadcrumbs once removed from the oven. While you are waiting for the cauliflower to bake, place all of the ingredients for the dip into a blender and blend until combined. Serve with the cauliflower bites.
