WRH Sweeps Ontario Hospital Association Conference

Windsor Regional Hospital made a terrific showing at the recent OHA conference. Three awards presented to our organization included:

Green Health Care Award for initiatives in the area of pollution prevention including the recycling program, move toward a mercury free lab, reduction of air pollution emissions and water conservation.

Best Practice - for the Surgical Safari program. Surgical Safari is a pre-operative tour conducted by Child Life Specialists intended to reduce the anxiety of children undergoing surgery. The tour allows children and their families to prepare for and become more familiar with the hospital environment.

Healthy Hospital Innovators Award - Given by the National Quality Institute, the purpose of this award is to recognize OHA member organizations for their commitment to implementing a comprehensive and strategic approach to the development and sustainability of a healthy workplace. WRH has now earned a Level II award. This achievement also serves to recognize healthcare organizations that demonstrate their willingness to participate in the transfer of knowledge regarding their program successes and challenges.

Ron Foster Named Communicator of the Year by the OHA

In addition to our organization winning awards, our own **Ron Foster** was named *Communicator of the Year* at the 2007 OHA Conference. To be eligible, one must be a member of the communications staff of OHA's member hospitals. Winners demonstrate outstanding work in the field of health care communication, for the betterment of health care in Ontario as well as a commitment to excellence in communications and involvement in external networks, associations or professional affiliations. Hilary Short, President of the OHA, in presenting the award said "You are the ambassadors of the health care system, sharing our greatest successes and advocating tirelessly on behalf of our hospitals and patients. The individual we are honouring today exemplifies the best qualities of a great communicator". In accepting the award, Mr. Foster indicated that winning the award was unexpected but graciously accepted on behalf his team.
