WRH's Children Centre to Receive Funding

Our local MPPs, Ministers Dwight Duncan and Sandra Pupatello were at Windsor Regional Hospital recently to announce a \$4.35 million boost from the Provincial Government. Spread out over two years, the grant will enable the construction on the \$5.35 million Regional Children's Centre Family Learning Place. The remaining \$1 million required to complete the project has been pledged by the community-led W. E. Care For Kids campaign. "This grant means they will get the building and the surroundings which they deserve. Every time I entered the old building, I knew it was the wrong place for kids to be," said Mary Broga. The new W.E. Care For Kids Home will include 16 residential rooms, a pool and gymnasium. "This community has never failed to step forward when it comes to doing the right thing for individuals who need help," said MPP Sandra Pupatello , the Province's Minister of Economic Development and Trade. "And this government recognizes that fact and we are delighted to help." The new centre replaces two 40-year-old buildings and will provide residential, day treatment and school-based programs for children with mental health needs. The residence will be able to serve up to 50 children a year. While some children receiving treatment stay in the residence, others are able to go home in the evenings and become reintegrated into their own family lives. Finance Minister Dwight Duncan said the centre is "an investment in our future because with just a little bit more help, these children have a chance at a great future."
