Windsor Regional Hospital's submission called 'A Problem With Parts Was Part Of Our Problem' won the 2011 People's Choice Innovation Award for recognition of excellence and innovation in Health Care at the recent Innovations Expo in Toronto. The submission outlined the tracking, monitoring and quality improvement changes that were put into place to promote the reduction of irreplaceable specimen errors. Specimen handling is an error prone process that must be clearly defined in any organization. The result was an overall 50% reduction in O.R. irreplaceable specimen error rates. A definition of irreplaceable specimen (parts) include difficult or impossible to recollect specimens and placing the patient in danger if not being able to be recollected. Attendees at the Innovations Expo voted for the best poster at the Expo. Congratulations to all those involved in making this practice work at Windsor Regional Hospital!

Period of Purple Crying

Windsor Regional Hospital, in partnership with the Windsor Essex County Health Unit, recently launched a media campaign to increase public awareness about Shaken Baby Syndrome Prevention. For the month of November babies born at Windsor Regional Hospital will be given "PURPLE" knitted caps donated by local groups involved with the Rotary Club of Windsor Roseland to raise awareness about the prevention of Shaken Baby Syndrome, the most serious and the most common form of infant abuse. Along with this initiative, Southwestern Ontario hospitals and health units have also come together to increase public awareness about this "Period of PURPLE Crying". The Period of PURPLE Crying, is an education program in which parents and caregivers are educated both in hospital and in the community regarding normal newborn crying patterns.
