## Wave 2 QBP teams are reaching the next stage in their journey

After 4 months of work, the teams working on developing best practice QBP Improvement Bundles for Hemorhagic Stroke, Transient Ischemic Attach (TIA), Joint Replacement and Knee Arthroscopy are nearing the next stage in their continuious improvement journey.

Both the Stroke and the Joint groups will be submitting their Order Sets, Clinical Pathways, and Patient Experience Pathways for final endorsement by the Medical Advisory Committee (MAC) later this month. Final reviews of the new mobile app conditions for Knee Replacement, Hip Replacement and Knee Arthrocopy are wrapping up. Patients with these conditions will be able to access important information about their condition, including helpful recovery information to prepare for their elective surgery and tips for recovery at home.

More information about roll-out plans will be coming as we prepare to launch the Wave 2 conditions at the beginning of January.
